Already 8 weeks has gone by since we were in the U.S.A. and no words can express our gratitude to all of you who have opened up your heart, your home and your generosity. We say a special thanks to Brother Clyde and Nancy Barber for letting us use their car to travel while in the U.S. This is the third time they have done it, even if we put on several miles every time.

Since our return we have not ceased to be busy with church meetings, Bible classes, preaching, teaching, home Bible studies with contacts, visiting the sick, working on presentations and new brochures in French.

It is always good to return home, after a 3 months of absence. But you know what? Every time we come back there is always something that breaks down either an appliance or something else, and of course I am always ready to fix it.

We had the sad news of the death of Sister Helen Donchery from Reims, and we have known this family for more than 30 years. This dear sister was always busy putting others first in her life and always willing to go the extra mile for others. Rose and I went and participated in the funeral of Sister Helen. We miss her but it is comforting to know that she went home to be with the Lord.

We also heard of the passing away of sister Voahangy from Madagascar. We met her the first time we went there to work with the church and the orphanage, and she visited us in Paris few years ago. Some more sad news was the death of Tom Butler our fellow schoolmate when we were at Sunset in Lubbock. He and I have knocked many doors together and studied with people. We ask your prayers for Iris Butler and family, for Voahangy's family and Helene's family. Our life's are surely as a vapor as Scripture says.

Since our return, I started a Bible study with James, a young, Haitian man (20 years old) that has been coming to Bible class and worship for the last 2 months. He comes regularly on Sunday and always on time for Bible class, and every Wednesday he comes to the study right after his school, where he studies electrical engineering. It is my prayer that he will soon obey the Gospel, his Mother is a member of the Lord's Church and his aunt is also. His Father is a Catholic.

In November we are planning on going to Lille and on November 17th we will have our Annual Internal Retreat for the Church, and the theme for this year is based on Ephesians 5:1-5. "Be imitators of Christ" and four brethren the congregation will speaking including me.

My dear partners in Christ, we want express our gratitude to God and to all of you for your prayers and generosity, love and care throughout the many years that you been involved with us.
