Still in the same month of May, two other souls answered the gospel call, thereby making the total of souls saved to ascend to number 5. These two other souls are Brother Godlove and Brother John. In fact such a figure is unprecedented insofar as local evangelism in a period of 4 weeks and within the boundaries of Limbe is concerned. This is a call



for joy as I join with you again in what will go down in West African Mission's history as a report of one of the best fulfillment of the



Lord's promise, in His great commission, to be with us always. Apart from Him we can do nothing. The confirmation of the Lord's attendance of our evangelism outreaches is in evidence every time and everywhere we go to make disciples. As we rise to the majestic

heights of our campaign for Him in Cameroon, it is neither unessential nor miscellaneous to recognize the tireless sweat of our cheerful donors in giving of their means for the extension of the territories of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ in Cameroon. blessed the work of preaching in Cameroon. a church is nothing else except our church building. The challenge of our church building is increasingly evident especially as the rains are pouring in more heavily to move the rainy season from introductory stage to prolonged heavy downpour season of the year. The rains

structure. Last Sunday the rain was so torrential that I had to stop preaching awaiting the reduction in the noise produced by the bucketing raindrops on the zinc. It was not very easy to helplessly watch our visitors dampened by sprinkling in the showery rain that drove every single one in attendance to one

corner of the uncompleted construction. Embarrassing you think? Well, to some extent we were. However, the visitors we had were a special kind of visitors. Very special indeed! One of them is an officer of the Cameroonian army. The other is a musician. Both of them are now in Christ and the church.

Also in May, I was temporarily out of Limbe to participate in



the monthly Fako/Littoral gospel meeting which organized by the Tiko Church of Christ. I spoke for an hour on "BEING BORN AGAIN".

Back in Limbe, our mass media preaching is doing a great deal of harm to circulation denominational doctrines. Our
