time in two months. The Islamic militants besieged the village on the first Sunday of the month, to the point that the road was taken over. We were unable to make our way to the Church. But my joy is that even in the midst of this, the Church was still able to meet for worship without my being there. Whatever that happens, even if I am not there again, the Church is alive to God's glory.

My Friday class with Mazah congregation is going on well. We are rebuilding the worshipping place. It is difficult for us because of the meager contribution we make on Sunday. But God's grace is sufficient for us, as we are moving gradually. Please keep us in prayers. The building is so important to us because the mentality of people around there is that a church without building is a frustrated church. The state of building made our weekly evangelism difficult. The good thing is that the Christians know better than what the culture knows. So even though we were meeting in dilapidated building, their faith was still together. We did not lose any member on account of the state of worshipping place.

For the past few weeks, I have been handling a class on "Christian Life of Holiness" at Ring Road Church of Christ. The class is challenging as I have to teach myself first to reach others. It is generating interest on daily basis. We hope after the class members will draw a thick line between holy things and profanity. We can make a difference in the world if we make clear difference between the things of God and the ungodly things. I have taught 11 Bible classes with two different congregations. During the month of July, I set up 9 bible studies. We are hoping that these studies will help the prospect come to understanding of the biblical salvation, and if possible give themselves unto Christ. Please, pray along with me. Also, I was opportune to present a lesson on reconciliation in Highland FM, Jos on the last Sunday of July.

The School of Biblical Studies resumes in the next two weeks for 2015/16 academic session. I am getting ready to teach 6 courses plus dealing with other related students' challenges. This week (Thursday and Friday), I am speaking at the National Youth Program here in Jos. Pray for me to be able to impact these youths positively.

Thank you for praying for my mother who was sick last month. Presently, she is still receiving treatment, and her health is better than before. At the same time, I covet the prayers of the saints for my wife, Sandra, who is down with acute malaria and typhoid fever. She is undergoing treatment. Our faith is not in the drugs, but in God who is capable of empowering the drugs to work effectively.

Rescue at Sea

Your father died in a shipwreck 10 years ago and your older brother, Paul, has been lost at sea for three weeks. Hans, you are all I have left."

Hans replied, "Mother, I have to go. What if everyone said, 'I can't go, let someone else do it?'" Mother, this time I have to do my duty. When the call for service comes, we all need to take our turn and do our part." Hans kissed his mother, joined the team and disappeared into the night.

Another hour passed, which seemed to Hans' mother like an eternity. Finally, the rescue boat darted through the fog with Hans standing up in the bow. Cupping his hands, the captain called, "Did you find the lost man?" Barely able to contain himself, Hans excitedly yelled back, "Yes, we found him. Tell my mother it's my older brother, Paul!"
