Dear Ladies,

This has been a couple of busy months. Roland has done taxes in February. I just sign my name and he sends them on.

My large hyacinths ladies are just about finished and I have a few daffodils and grape hyacinths still blooming. My friend Lionel is still planning on redoing my window boxes. We had some snow here the other day and lots of wind and rain since then.

It has been a noisy, dusty, stinky time with the electricians replacing all things electrical, upstairs and down. Even when the men sometimes sweep, we have to do it again and the dust keeps falling. Many of you that have done this probably remembers well. It will be

so much better and safer to get this work done. My dog has been real good and so far I have lost none of my birds.

I had a problem with my blood pressure so my doctor changed my medicine. It went down from 190/100 to 140/90 and I lost three kilos which is 6 lbs. 6 ounces in a month's time without dieting. The new medicine has a diuretic.

Nathan Moyers visited the other day but didn't get to see him, but talked with him on the phone.

I haven't had many studies with the children because of the electricity work. They should be done in April so I will get back to a more normal schedule. In February 5,549 people visited the website, and they were from 66 countries. In March there were 5,744 visitors from 72 countries.

The three children from the new family named Ben and Alma Green will be in my Bible class on Sunday morning when they are here or on Sunday evening. When they come that will bring the number of children in my class to nine. I sometimes have 4 children in Sunday night class. We have had several visitors from Austin, TX., some from Tennessee and other places.

Next month we will have visitors from Tennessee staying with us and some from Delaware then in May from Cameroun, Africa. All the more reason to get the dust cleared and apartment ready for company.

We have someone staying with us now. More on all this later and thank you all for your love and care of us and the Lord's Church in Paris, France.





N.B. Hardeman – Church Work

Worth considering today

“Now, may I ask, what is the purpose of the church of the Lord? Suppose I discuss the negative side first. I may say some things with which you do not agree, but I bid you hear me regardless. I do not

consider it a part of the work of the church to try to run the government. I am taught in the Bible to be subject unto the powers that be, just so far as I think they do not conflict with some law of God. Again, I say to you with caution and thought, that it is not the work of the church to furnish entertainment for the members. And yet many churches have drifted into such an effort. They enlarge their basements, put in all kinds of gymnastic apparatus, and make every sort of an appeal to the young of the congregation. I have never read anything in the Bible that indicated to me that such was a part of the work of the church. I am wholly ignorant of any Scripture that even points in that direction. Furthermore, it is not the work of the church to try to adjust labor troubles, or to supervise our social conditions. It was never intended that the church should run politics, stop wars, supervise public morals, or to be any kind of a collecting agency to pile up a large sum of money. The church should not go into the banking business. Money is contributed for the work of the Lord, and my observation is, that if you want to take the life out of a church, and rob it of doing good, just pile up a big fund in the church. Many will quit giving altogether or reduce their amount to a minimum. Churches should be encouraged to give liberally, and the money should be used, as it accumulates, for some worthy cause. Let the churches look ahead and keep the good work going.”
