One good thing about all of these is that we live each day at a time, knowing that our end may soon come. It no longer matter again how long we live, but how well we live. Your constant prayers for us continue to yield positive result, in God averting dangers from reaching us. Our Government promised security, but God continues to be true that no one should trust human security. Last Wednesday, a suicide bomber blew herself up in the market killing scores of innocent people in the same village where Boko Haram abducted over 200 teenage girls from school. Just last Saturday night, 86 people were murdered in cold blood and some roasted by the terrorist group. Several people were rendered homeless and new set of

widows, widowers and orphans emerged. The Devil does not relent in carrying out evil, we must be alert, up and active in carrying out our master's assignment.

Brethren, join me in praising God for saving my wife and my lives in an accident last week, that involved our car. A running car, experiencing brake failure, came from the rear, and hit our car on the highway. God gave me the wisdom to hold on the car without going off road. Though the car is damaged, we came out of the car without even a bruise on our skin. To God be the glory.

We make arrangement as human beings, but we rely on God for success. We are inviting preachers and teachers far and wide within the country to be part of this program. Keep praying for peace to reign in the Nigeria for people to be able to move about their normal business. I equally pray God to intervene in the current spread of ZIKA virus in South American region. There are many things attacking man's life on earth. We at this end are battling with Lassa fever and bird flu. Several bird farms have been ravaged by bird flu and dozens of people have lost their lives to Lassa fever. God will see us through all of these. I appreciate you all for supporting us to continue the in this ministry of reconciliation. May God bless you all.
