REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 2016 – TOM EK POT JR



My dearly beloved in Christ, may the grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ be available to you all in Jesus name. We are grateful to God for His immeasurable love and

kindness shown to us all throughout the month of June and of course throughout this year. To Him be the glory. Half of the year is gone, and we are left with the next half to realize our goals. We appreciate you all for standing by us in heralding the goodnews of salvation to the Africans. May God bless you all.

Within the month of June as I mentioned in my May report, I was out of Jos for two weeks teaching and training local preachers and elders in Agbor, Delta State. I

preached in two separate congregations, one in the State capital (Asaba) and the other one in Agbor. Delta is one of the states in Niger Delta region of the country. I thank God because the two weeks I was there, we experienced peaceful moment in that area. Even though the activities



of the Niger Delta militants were reported every day in other places, yet in Agbor where we were having our daily classes, there was no problem. Each day we met from 8am-5pm, except on

Sundays. It was a hectic moment. We had 14 students this time. I am grateful to God because this particular set of students will soon graduate. You can see in the picture that some of them are quite elderly in age. Their devotion and readiness to increase their knowledge challenged me



each time I went there. This time around, I was teaching them Biblical Hermeneutics and Evangelizing the African Indigenous Religions practitioners. The

two courses are practical courses. The students were glad they had the opportunity to learn something that will improve the quality of their teaching, preaching, and leadership. The congregations at Mazah and Foron (both Mission and New Foron) all in Jos are still growing even though gradually. I have resumed my classes with them since my return. We are in the mid of raining season.

Some of our programs are thus affected by the heavy down pour. We thank God because our worship services are never affected.

Since on my returned for about 9 days now, I have been talking to a group of denominational leaders on what the biblical Church is and the practice of biblical Christianity. I realize that several of these people are so ignorant of what the Bible teaches. All what they hold firmly unto is their church traditions. They are surprise to hear that the word pastor is the same as elders. I know it may take them time to accept the truth, but I am glad the seed is sown in them. I also realized that they are concerned about their means of livelihood if they quite from their so called pastoral duties. The mixed feeling I have is that I won't meet most of them again as they will be returning to their places this weekend. I have however collected their phone numbers that we may keep interacting. At the same time, I am trying to see how to link them with some brethren in Lagos where they reside. They only came to Jos for a program. I know it is tough for them to make a decision.

Keep praying for us, even as we go about our responsibilities in the second half of the year. Nigerian economy is really bad. Life is quite challenging, but we are grateful because we are alive. We know God has something better for us as we go through this tough time in the history of Nigeria. On behalf of my family, I say big thank you to you all for standing with and by us to spread the gospel.
