
APRIL 2016 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA

The Church of Christ in the South west of Cameroon is gaining more audience nowadays than the denominations. Prior to the advent of West African Missions work in the region, the church was overshadowed by the heavy presence of very many religious groups not embellished by Christ. It was really a sad period of our history as the Church of Christ in this country. I quite remember the state of the church in my early years in Limbe. In those days, the only means of evangelism was that of meeting people in their homes. Door knocking, we call it. Upon introduction of yourself as a member of the Church of Christ to the prospect in front of whom you are standing, the usual response from the prospect was, “Which church is the Church of Christ?” Such an embarrassing obscurity has been forcefully uprooted by a careful enthronement of a new dimension of Cameroon missions. This new project involves a number of methodologies, outstanding among which is the radio waves that transmit our preaching into the homes and offices of listeners. Our Cameroonian society is still very underdeveloped in terms of modern means of communication. That accounts for the reason these services are very expensive here. However, we

believe that nothing is too precious to be sacrificed for the sake of evangelism. By God's grace we will continue to commit our best efforts and resources to the work of preaching, making good use of the media to reach out to many at the same time.

Our dream is to establish at least a radio and television station for the Church of Christ in Cameroon. We hope to achieve these goals in the future. Meanwhile, we are making serious progress in our preaching campaigns using both modern and traditional means of reaching the people for Christ. Many of the people who have heard the gospel through this means are now members of the church. And now, let me mention a soul that the Lord added to the church in the month of April. His name is Mukete.

He responded to our preaching in the church on one of those Sunday services. Indeed, the Lord is adding to our number almost monthly those who are being saved. Thanks to Him for saving Mukete from sin.



That is why we really need a radio station. Of all the congregations in Cameroon, only three have the courage to preach

on radio. There is no television program for preaching the gospel in the whole country for all the decades of the churches' existence since the 1950's. The Lakeside Radio program of the Kumba Church is only 30 minutes. That is about 2 hours monthly. How many questions can one exhaustively answer within that length of radio time? In Limbe we have managed to secure 3 hours on Sunday and 1 hour on Friday which is a market day in Limbe. That is a total of 4 hours per week and about 16 hours per month. Another effort to reach out to the people through the radio is the one established by one our radio converts named Abanda Edwin. After his conversion, Abanda Edwin immediately went home to his village to evangelize his parents and other family members. His father responded well to his preaching and was baptized. This was the beginning of the church there in Mbengwi. Abanda then return to Limbe to study in a local Bible school of the Church of Christ in the outskirts of Limbe. At the same time he was following me to Eden Radio to learn the ways of radio campaign. Now there is a radio program of evangelism in Mbengwi. These are the only mass media efforts so far. Limbe is leading in this regard. This is to suggest that our presence in Cameroon has changed the game of the campaign for Christ in terms of modus operandi. We try to accomplish all these efforts in the midst of many challenges. My son had an injury in school in April. It was a difficult time to watch him agonize through it all. He is getting better now.

Our meeting place of worship is another uphill task. We are building it gradually, at the pace that we can afford. That's not all. We are equally dedicating our best efforts to the arduous responsibility of edifying the saints in the church. This one is harder to do than the construction of the worship auditorium. By the grace of God we are trying to do what is possible to keep the believers growing, leaving what is beyond our jurisdiction to the One with Whom all things are possible.

We will always recognize the tireless contributions of those who help us in one way or the other in the process of winning souls for Christ in Cameroon. We are heavily indebted to all of you, our supporters. As you read this report, please keep in mind that we love and appreciate every one of you in various congregations of the churches of Christ in America. We thank you for standing with us in the good fight of faith in Christ. We thank God for you. God bless you.
