August 2016 was a very special month for us as a family. Let me begin this report with the activities that marked the end of the



month under inspection. August was the month in which my son, Providence, came into this world 7 years ago. Providences' birthday was accorded some special attention as compared to other anniversaries of his birth. This kid preacher, also called Prof, is thanking all of you for wishing him well across the years, especially whenever his birthday August 28 draws near. Together with his sister Nsikanima, here is your missionary's son who turned 7 on August 28, 2016, displaying the birthday greeting card his family in Ellabell posted to him. The 2016 anniversary of Prof's birthday was a memorable occasion. The event



was decorated with a drama performance by little children of age 10 and below. That means, Providence, the chief celebrant, delivered the sermon.
