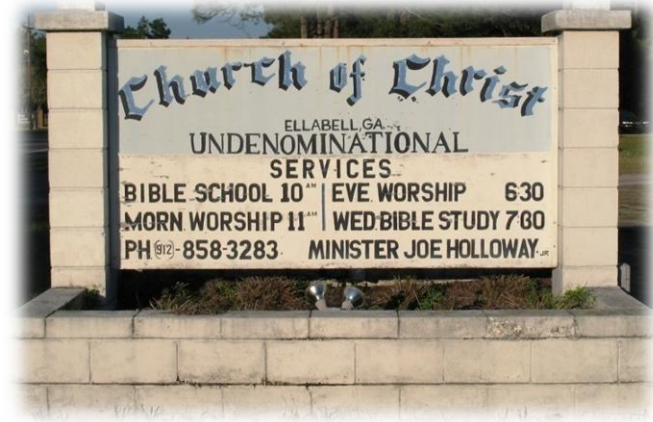

Neale Thomas Pryor, 75, of Searcy, passed from this life Sunday, September 25, 2011.

He was born Saturday, October 5, 1935 in Mayfield, Kentucky to Carrie Colene Clark and Neale Bressie Pryor.

His early years were spent in Bardwell, Lexington and in Mayfield, Kentucky, where he received his early

education. He developed a love for music and played first trumpet in the school band. He was called from class many times to play Taps at funerals.

His upper-level work was done at Freed-Hardeman College, Harding College, Vanderbilt University, Harding School of Theology, and New Orleans Baptist Seminary, where he received his B.A., Masters, Masters, and Doctorate degrees. He also received honorary doctorates from Freed-Hardeman University and Harding University.

He received the Distinguished Teacher Award three times from

Harding University, as well as the Harding University Distinguished Alumni Award. He served the university for 45 years where he taught Bible, was chairman of the Bible Department, was director of the annual Bible Lectureship, and served as Vice President for Academic Affairs. Additionally, he was a sponsor for Beta Phi Social Club, assistant sponsor for Alpha Chi, was a member of the Local Optimist Club.

In addition to authoring the book, *You Can Trust Your Bible*, he wrote for many Christian publications. Through the years he preached over 500 gospel meetings in more than 40 states and several foreign countries. He also officiated at many marriage ceremonies and preached numerous funerals, including his son's, Alan Neale, who preceded him in death nine years ago.

He was blessed with the ability to remember everything he read and could make each person feel special by remembering their name. He enjoyed spending time with his family, playing tennis, running, and teaching young people at Camp Tahkodah .

He was preceded in death by his parents, one grandchild, Mallory Sloan, and his son, Alan Neale Pryor. He is survived by his wife, Treva Terrell Pryor, of 51 years; Lori, Ellis, Camille, and Benjamin Sloan of Searcy; Kerrin, Dylan, and Nikole Pryor of Sparta, Tennessee; Jackie and Larry Jackson of Mayfield, Kentucky and numerous nieces, nephews and other family and friends.

He was a member of the College Church of Christ where he served as elder and taught the auditorium Bible class.

Visitation was 4-6 p.m. Tuesday, September 27 at Roller-Daniel Funeral Home, 411 East Race Street in Searcy. Funeral services were 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, September 28, at Benson Auditorium on Harding University Campus. Interment was at Oak Grove Cemetery on Moore Street in Searcy following the funeral. In memory of Dr. Pryor, contributions may be made to Harding University or your favorite charity.

Too Many Years Ago

I was a student at Harding University. I learned much there which I have only begun to appreciate in the last few years. One of the hardest professors I can remember challenged every part of my being. I struggled in his classes. He took the Bible very seriously and demanded I do as well. I wanted to have a good time as a college student. he wanted me to be a serious scholar of the Scriptures. He accepted no excuses and believe me I tried. When he was promoted to Dean of Academic Affairs, I knew he would have too many duties to teach Bible. He kept those classes. He had an easy-going disposition and a quick sense of humor and simply expected I would take all this Biblical stuff as seriously as

he did. His name is Dr. Neale Pryor. Dr. Pryor left this life yesterday and I realized I finally have begun to take it all as seriously as he did. It just took me an extra 30 years. Dr. Pryor, you made a convert of me. The Lord's Church has lost a serious Bible Scholar and a dynamic Gospel Preacher. Good-bye to a much beloved mentor. I hope I can live up in a small way to your huge legacy. I do take pride in the fact that I can say, "I was a student of Dr. Neale Pryor so I have learned from the best."
