




The UN Building in Abuja

August some Muslims went into the village and killed some people. So, the villages are compelled to form themselves into security guards in the night. The ripple of this problem overflow into Jos, and some innocent people were killed, especially students. The full measure of this problem came into Jos on the 29th, which is last Monday. Since then, confusion erupted again in Jos, cars are burnt, many people are killed, already. Some have fled from their homes. Brethren, we are living in fear because of this confusion, but our faith is not dampened. Islam is one of the worst things that have happened to the world. As you might have heard, last Friday (26th), a suicide bomber attacked the United Nation's building, killing several innocent people and injuring several others. Last Sunday, in Bauchi State, a neighboring state to Plateau State, a woman was caught trying to bomb a denominational building. Brethren, we cannot recount the magnitude of insecurity and threat Islam has posted to humanity. This is the more reason that we still need to gear up effort to see if

we can save some from fire. Please, continue to pray for us. Our heart of sympathy goes to the family of late Buck, especially his wife Sharon. May God comfort her in a time like this. We equally sympathize with the families who lost their relations and properties in Hurricane Irene. Events like this remind us that this is not our home, we are only passing through. I appreciate you all for your support and prayers. May God continue to bless you all.
