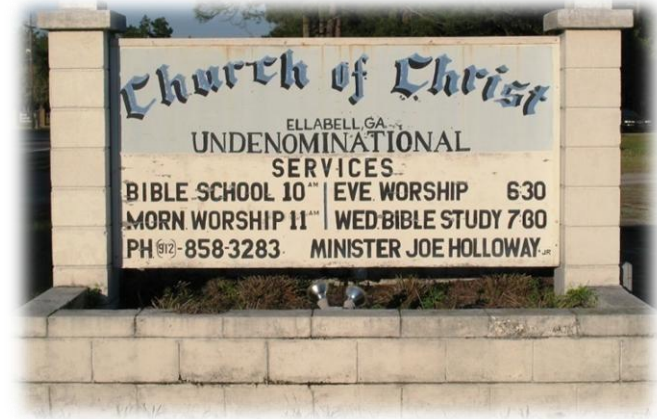

 "The Lord's our rock, in Him we hide, A shelter in the time of storm; Secure whatever ill betide, A shelter in the time of storm" said V. J. Charlesworth in his song titled "A Shelter in the Time of Storm". This is our message of

security and refuge to the brethren of Central Church of Christ in Tuscaloosa and other Christians who have been devastated in any way by the most recent Alabama tornado. You all are in our prayers. And now on a lighter note, do remember that as my personal computer understands, anything that affects Alabama affects Abasiama.

Here in Cameroon the most recent storm has been the epidemic of cholera which has presently entered Limbe. A number of people have already died. I myself was diagnosed of diarrhea which has taken toll on my health and affected my output at the Mile 14 lectureship in the village of Dibanda. The diarrhea has

ceased after the intake of some antibiotics and the salty oral re-hydration therapy.



As fishers of men, we continued to preach the gospel to the lost and many people were baptized. At the Dibanda evangelism outreach, 7 souls were added to the body of Christ. Another occasion for soul-winning was the Small Ekombe youth forum 8 souls surrendered to the Savior. At home in Limbe, our cultivation of the hearts of people with the seed of the gospel by means of radio and personal contacts continues to yield fruits.

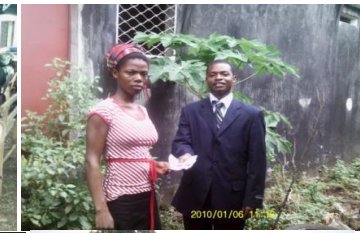
