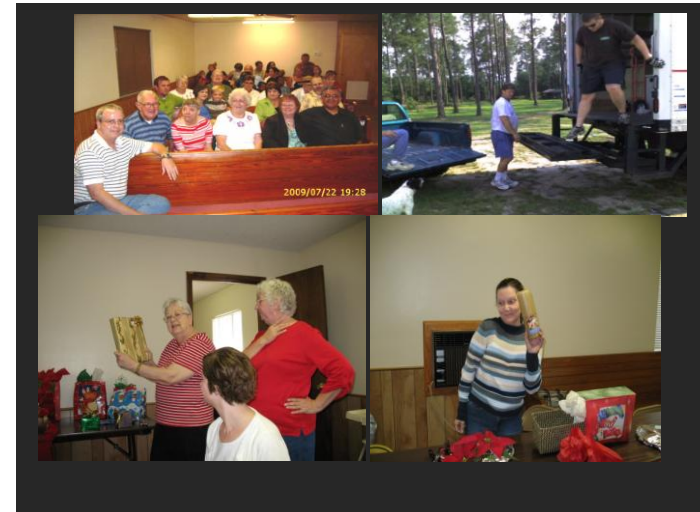

REPORT FOR MONTH OF JULY 2012 (TOM EKPO JR)

Dear Brethren in Christ, I salute you all in Jesus name. I pray that the grace of God that was available to all of God's children be multiplied for us this new month. Thank you immensely for taking time to pray for us. I tell you, our Good Lord was at work in the lives of His children. Though the wicked may be working hard to stop God's children from living for Him, the Lord is granting those who are His the sufficient grace to overcome every hurdle. We would not have come this far if not for your continued support and prayers. Once again, I say thank you.

During the month of July, we experienced heavy rainfall. Rainfall that crated floods in several places in Jos. The flood left not less than ten people dead. I thank God because though the flood destroyed my fence, no other property in my house was destroyed. It is amazing because some places are experiencing drought, but we are having excess of rainfall. In every situation, we are to thank God for His goodness.

The challenges confronting us seem to come from every angle. As I mentioned in one of my mails, you might have heard of the rubbery of the Mazah congregation. We lost all our valuables. This came at a time we are struggling to see if we can rebuild the walls that fell last year and have a roof over our head. We had to use a tarpaulin to cover one side of the fallen wall, and zinc to cover the other side. The miserable thief stole the tarpaulin, church table, communion vessels, and our song books. In all of these, he cannot use any, except the table and the tarpaulin. One wonders why the communion vessels if not that the person does not want to see us exist. This single act has made the church to be more determined to fight the battle of winning souls for Christ. They are not discouraged at all. Continue to pray for us. Throughout the month of July, though we mostly worshipped under tense conditions, none of our services were interrupted. Keep praying for us that we may be able worship God under a serene atmosphere. For the past two months, I have been teaching four Bible classes a week, as the School of Biblical Studies resumes this August, I may readjust to at least three to cope with the challenges in the school as well. My two sons are on holiday. My younger son does not want to return to dormitory. He wants to go to school from the house. Well, we see how that works for the first term of next academic session. Keep praying for the church at Kakuruk in Plateau State where the whole village has been displaced, their houses were burnt by Muslims militants. May our Good Lord continue to bless you all in your good work. Once again, I say thank. Grace and Peace, Tom.

A Couple Of Thoughts From The Preacher's Desk

The recent events here in Ellabell have caused me to pause for a moment and contemplate our future here. I know we are a small place and a small congregation. This fact is brought up to me often. Sister Sandy has not been able to come to services

Tom shows in his report the Gospel is being preached in West Africa. The Mohsens were here from Paris to thank us for the support they receive from us and report on the work there.

I am not able to put large numbers on our attendance board. I look forward to the days I can do so but I can see large numbers in our accomplishments lately. A small congregation in numbers we are. A large congregation in accomplishments we are as well. No, we should not grow complacent and satisfied. We need to continue to look for ways to serve. It occurs to me that our members, the community of Ellabell, Nigeria, Cameroon, Paris, and the world are better off because of the Ellabell Church of Christ. The little Ellabell Church? She has earned the right to be called my favorite name for her. She is the 'Old Ship of Zion.' Now, feel good for a moment, then start finding something else to do. Let's keep it up.
