ABASIAMA'S REPORT FROM CAMEROON (MAY 2012)

What a wonderful privilege for me to come your way again with what is making news about the mission of preaching in Cameroon. You and I both know that everywhere in the world people are fighting for freedom. This fight for freedom ranges from issues concerning external interference in a people's internal political and economic affairs to freedom from disease and pain and fear and so on. But a very relatively few people are aware of or interested in the good fight of faith that desperately seeks to lead people into true freedom, namely, the freedom in Christ.



Ours is the blessed commission of teaching and preaching the good news of liberty provided by Christ to lost sinners. Brother Heman was one such individual lost in sin and without Christ in the world. The greatest difference in his life came when he found the Savior or rather was


found by the Savior through our ministry in the month of May. Heman is a young man in his early twenties and very hardworking. I

preached to him one on one concerning Christ and His salvation plan. Unlike many of our prospects with whom we are currently studying the Bible, Heman saw the immediate need to make things right with his Maker. Now he is a saved sinner and with Christ in the world. Look at him and me here in the water at the occasion of his immersion. He has been in fellowship with us ever after his life-changing death, burial, and resurrection with Christ. He is a new creature and we all are celebrating his new birth event all with the angels in Heaven. So, we are now poised for the raising of the walls of the auditorium. That sounds like progress at the pace of a snail speed. But such an assessment is far from the truth of the real investment in the building are some pictures of the building which has gulped some serious amount of francs CFA. Any valid evaluation of the state of progress of the Mile One church building must take into account the

current financial milieu of the church coupled with a history of more than a decade of rental arrangements. Therefore, we have every reason to appreciate God for the great thing He has done among us in the congregation.

The annual preachers' forum took place in the month of May at the premises of the Bonaberi Christ in Douala. I was there at the forum to speak on "Taking the Pew above Denominational Attractions", a topic that sought to equip the ministers with the skills to help their congregations maintain a firm grip on the truth so as to avoid activities of the Denominations being enticed by the false but attractive worship and activities of the denominations. A reflection on the forum that gathered the ministers of the gospel from across the nation to Bonaberi leaves anyone who attended with a deep sense of accomplishment and success. Another interesting topic that was deliberated upon was "Signs of a worn-out Preacher". In the discussion of this issue, the various symptoms that indicate a decline in the productivity of a minister as he goes about his job with the congregation were examined and solutions determined. I thank God for the opportunity to contribute my small part to the big success of the annual event.

Considering the above accomplishments, it is easy to understand why I always appreciate our heroic helpers and daring donors whose laudable financial contributions to the actualization of the dreams of the great commission of our Lord is indispensable. Thank you dear partners and fellow citizens of heaven, for without your helping hands, the healing hands of Jesus might not have touched people like brother Heman who now worships God acceptably with the Church of Christ because you assisted us to take the gospel to him. I Thank you for caring enough to support our preaching work West Africa, and in Cameroon in particular where I labor in the Lord. For those of you whose financial assistance is ensuring the upkeep of the orphans, these young ones send you their love and appreciation for your charity. We thank you the minister of the Ellabell church, Dr Holloway, for your fruitful labor in the Lord and with us in the West African Missions for over a decade now. God bless you, sir. God bless the church at Ellabell and God bless all of you who support us in a financial way. Thank you for praying for us. May our combined effort keep bringing more souls into the united Kingdom of Christ.
