

Dearly beloved in Christ, I salute you all in the Precious Name of Our Savior Jesus Christ. I appreciate you all individually and collectively for taking time to pray for us in Africa. The Lord is doing great work here. Recently, we heard in the news that the Islamic terrorist group tormenting the northern Nigeria is calling for cease fire with the Nigerian Military. I do not know how true that is, and how sincere they are to such a plea. That will not stop us from being on our knees all the time to the Lord. This week, one of my students lost their home to some Muslims who invaded their village and burnt down people homes. So, we do not know whether the call for peace is true.

The month of January is over, and it is obvious that the year is moving fast also. Therefore, whatever has to be done should be done now as time will slip off our hands without us knowing. As the situation became too hot in the extreme North for Christians, some of them moved and settled in several places. We have some in Jos. And a sister who escaped the massacre came with 3 of her children. She and other refugees are in the refugee camp in Jos. We are trying to see how to secure an accommodation for her. The good news

here is that a door has been opened for us to take the gospel to these refugees. We were thinking that Jos is unsafe place, but to our dismay, some people ran for safety in Jos. It gives us confidence again that we look with disdain could be so valuable to others. Plans are on top gear for to reach these people with the Gospel. We are planning on giving them some food items as well. Please, keep this ministry in prayers.

Last weekend, the youth group of the Ring Road Congregation joined us. We moved like a locust into the small village around the school. Nearly every house heard the gospel preached. I am again trying to coordinate this young people to help them be useful for God. I don't have the wisdom on how to go about this. Therefore, I request for prayers for God to grant me wisdom to help these young people. My ministry in Mazah, Foron and Toro continues. God is sustaining these places, especially Foron and Toro who have witnessed attacks severally. Thank you for being for Christ and remaining His own all the seasons. Keep praying for us.

- Every congregation will have a few "loners" who do not mix well with others. Make a special effort to talk


with them and make them feel noticed.
