MARCH 2014 REPORT FORM CAMEROON-----Abasiama Archibong

We greet everyone in the worldwide team of the Great Commission and great congregations whose commitment to preaching the gospel of Christ is ever-green. About 2 millennial years ago, a great Savior made His first advent from heaven to earth to show us the way to God. About 2000 years later, millions of people are yet to have an encounter with Him. Hundreds of thousands of people are still without the gospel. We have accepted as our duty in Cameroon is to give our people the wonderful opportunity to meet this same Jesus. By the Father's grace, we are making efforts to preach Master Jesus in a country where most people practice magical juju. Indeed, any soul baptized is actually a deliverance from the dominion of darkness into the freedom of Christ. We always thank God for that freedom that we have come to enjoy in His kingdom. One of the most precious freedoms we celebrate is the one that has to do with our liberty to share the gospel with anyone who lets us tell them of the goodness of the good news of Christ. One such individual is Awani Niro. He accepted and believed it. Hence, we had



to baptize him into Christ. Here is the picture of the Niro baptism event. We thank God for the grace that always accompany the preaching of his message.

Apart from the birth of brother Awani into the body of Christ, we equally had other events in the month of March

that we consider worthy of our attention in this report. The first of those other events is the near-death experience of Brother Edward

Ndenge. Brother Ndenge is the husband of Sister Pauline and a very dedicated worker of the Lord. Pa Ndenge has been suffering from diabetes and High blood pressure for a number of years now. In the month of March he took a trip to the northwestern town of Bamenda. While in Bamenda, the elderly brother

went into coma for several hours. The wife, Sister Pauline had to embark on an emergency journey to Bamenda to help. Pa Ndenge was taken in an ambulance to Baffoussam for brain scanning, and then driven to Yaounde for further medical attention. Now, Pa is back in Limbe recuperating with the diabetic condition being managed. It is approximately impossible for me to vividly underscore the importance of Pa Ndenge's role in the growth of the Washing Point congregation in the last five years. In a nutshell, he has been a good example for all of the brethren to emulate his faith and hard work in the Lord. Pa Ndenge is a retired nurse. He is above 60 years old. He needs our prayers.

In another development, we are glad to share with you the good news of more opportunity to extend our radio evangelism to Eternity Gospel Radio, FM 96.5 MHz. All these years we have been reaching out to the population of Limbe through EDEN Radio. But now we are preaching on two radio stations. This additional station is helping us to reach out to where EDEN cannot reach. Places like Batoke can

now enjoy our thunderous LET THE BIBLE SPEAK, a program that has helped so many people to hear the gospel. The fruits of this newly open door of preaching given to us by God have already started pouring in as two souls are now members of our congregation. They were baptized last week, and the detail of that episode is reserved for April report. Our mission is soul-winning and vice versa. So, we will always thank God for helping us in this work. We will always thank Him for supporters like you. We know that without some form of help from someone, the work of preaching in Cameroon will be more wearisome. We live to appreciate your willingness to donate your hard-earned income for the missionary journeys in Cameroon. I thank Dr. Holloway for an excellent coordination of the mission work in Cameroon. I thank congregations and individuals for being personally committed to the cause of the Great commission in Cameroon. May God bless you now on earth and later on in Heaven.
