**Abasiama's November 2014
 Report From Cameroon**

I am grateful to the Lord for having carried us through the penultimate month of November that witnessed fruitful labors in the lord's vineyard in Limbe. As almost always, we celebrated the conversion of a precious soul who has come to Christ in the days of his youth. The church is equally gaining new heights our effort to make the fellowship a life-changing one for all the worshippers. This new dimension in our congregational

existence is also reflected progress we have made in the construction of our meeting place. Our active radio propagation of the word of God is full of impact in the southwest region of Cameroon.

The Congregation at Washing Point is



progressively gaining ground as more and more people are added to the fold by the Lord. For instance, we baptized brother Betrand Maufur into Christ during the month under recapitulation. He has been
