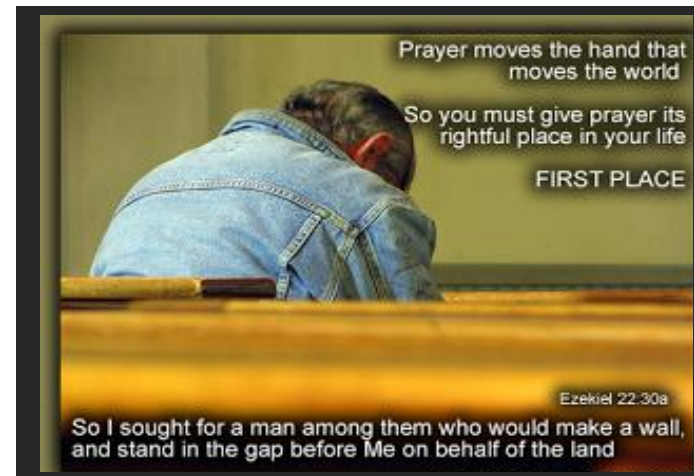

REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF JUNE 2014 (TOM EK POT JR)

My very dear brethren in Christ, I greet you all in Jesus name, praying that our good GOD continue to be with you in your happiness and pains, while we wait for the return of our LORD Jesus Christ. It is a sweet thing to be among those who love and care for you even when we are out of sight. We have become like our two eyes, even though we don't see each other, yet we see together, cry together, and sleep together. The fellowship of Christians will continue beyond here, where we will be all together with one echo always sounding praises to our MAKER. We long for that day. I do sincerely appreciate your prayers especially during the moment we have been thrown into some confusion as a result of bomb explosions. Truly, the situation is growing worst every day, but the hand of God is becoming stronger every second for us. Being alive today if purely the grace of God, I pray that He will help be achieve the essence of our existence.

The month of June is always an interesting month, marking the end of first half of the year, the weather is lovely, with intermittent rain fall without thunder and

storms. The rainfalls reduce the hardship people go through in looking for water. During this June, as always, I left Jos for two weeks leadership training program lasting for two weeks. This time I was in Nasarawa State, where some brethren in that region gathered for the program. Although I have been to this place before for evangelism and other purposes, I was there for the first time for this type of program. Nasarawa State, especially the capital city is dominated by the Muslims. We had 12 students who were very consistent in all our classes and three others who only attended at their convenience. Though the two weeks was a hectic time for us and the students, yet we were always looking for each day to come because the program was so exciting.

Seeing some elderly people so committed to learning more to do more for God made me wonder why I must not continue to desire to serve my Creator. I am the one standing in the middle. By my right is a retired agriculturist, who is presently diabetic, hypertensive, and has hepatitis B. He sometime wonders in the class which way is forward for his life as dietary rules for hepatitis conflicts with the treatment for diabetic. His name is Julius. But I tell you that he was always there to learn more to teach the young congregation is he now preaching for. By my left is court judge, who is retiring from service come this December. He is presently helping a small congregation in his village. Though he lives in the city, he goes to the village every weekend to help the small congregation he established. They were great inspiration to me.

This is the picture of the entire class. Majority of them are farmers in their local areas, and others are business men. Some of them left their families and farms for the two weeks. We had two women (married), with serious determination to teach the children classes in the Church. I was really moved by these brethren's zeal. Each day we were tired at the end of the day, but would be very early the next in the class. If there would be peace in the northern Nigeria, we have some hope for the growth of Church. The picture below is one of our class sessions. As you observe, there only two tables in the class, others are improvised by putting three chairs together. I really thank you all for your prayers. The two weeks were not

interrupted by any violence. This was because you were there praying for us. Thank you so much

In Jos, the Church in Mazah is doing well. I have not been able to worship with them throughout the month of June, but my Friday class with them is going on well. We are studying the life of Job in a book titled "More Beautiful than Gold," how he went through difficult time and came out victorious. We know that we also we come forth as gold to the glory of God. The Church in Foron is doing well. I have been with them for the last two Sundays. Their fear for attack remains just like their faith in God remains even stronger. It sounds paradoxical, but that is true. The reality of impending danger is there to remind that they may be attacked any day, but they have decided that even if they must die, they will die as Christians. Brethren, I have no doubt that there will be more women in heaven than men, am sorry if that offends anyone. But that is the truth in view of their zeal for God. This may not be true in every place, but is true in most of the places I have visited. As I mentioned some time back, two men are back in the Foron Mission congregation. My desire is to see them grow, so that one day they can continue with the work if it happens that I no longer go there. Keep praying for them. I do appreciate all you love for us. Your sacrifices will never go unrewarded by God. As you might have read from my mail to Brother Holloway, I lost one of my students to the cancer of pancreas. I asked for prayers on his behalf last month, and you did pray for him. Well, God decided that he should come back home and rest. He was a preacher of one of the biggest congregations in the Federal capital city of Abuja. His funeral is scheduled for 3rd July. Please, do remember his family in your prayers. His name is Benedict Nwakonta. May the peace of God rule your heart and his blessings be your share now and even unto eternity in Jesus' name.
