This World Is Not My Home

As the words of the song say, "This world is not my home;



I'm just a passing thru. My treasures are laid up somewhere beyond the blue". Jesus says, "Lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do

not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also (Matthew 6:20-21). We must lay up our treasures in heaven, not here on the earth. The Bible says, "And as it is appointed for man to die once, but after this the judgment" (Hebrews 9:27). When we draw our last breath, what we have accumulated here on the earth belongs to

someone else. After we die our fate is sealed and we will be judged.

Life here on earth is so temporary and short. Life passes so quickly. James 4:14 says, "Whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away." Many people are living their lives as though they will live forever here on the earth. One day this earth and all of its possessions will be burned up. No one knows when this will be. It was tensed time, as some people have to stand on the road to avoid anyone coming in to the meeting place with explosive or any dangerous weapon. Though we were in the worship all, yet we never stopped looking out through the window to see who was coming by. This was so because of the series threats we had on Saturday. As you are aware, on last Tuesday afternoon, there were twin blasts in the city center that claimed several lives. As that was not enough for them, last night, about 9:30pm, another one happened not too far from us. Am not sure the bomber was able to hit the target. Please, keep us in prayers, especially as I will be away this coming weekend for two weeks, teaching some Church leaders in Nasarawa State. My gratitude to the Church for always remembering us in prayers.
