FEBRUARY 2014 REPORT FROM CAMEROON.....ABASIAMA

The month of February came with a lot of opportunities to serve the Lord with a renewed determination in the Lord's vineyard of soul-winning. Please keep in mind that the Washing Point congregation is a developing church. With about twelve years of existence and a most recent average membership of fifty adults, the congregation has struggled to carry on its mission within the larger structure of the Lord global commission. The church maintains active outreach programs of evangelism through which many souls have been taught the gospel. A close look at Cameroon missions reveals the zeal and commitment of the stakeholders at home and abroad. In February 2014, we did a lot of evangelism. We are expecting fruits in the months ahead.

I think it is necessary for me to once in a while update you on the struggles and limitations the church at Washing Point is living with. It is necessary because the state of the church building is obviously affecting our work. I wish the skeletal

appearance had no discouraging impact on our visitors. The reality, however, is that people are working by sight. It takes maturity for someone to know that the magnificence of a church building does not determine the quality of glory given to God by the church. But what percentage of our new converts can have such an understanding? Well, we thank God that our preaching is touching lives and changing the destiny of souls in Limbe and in Cameroon as a whole.

So please permit me to refresh your memory of what we have tried to accomplish in this area of providing the church with a place of worship. We have worked extra hard to get to where we are now in terms of church building. Let me take you back to beginning of this momentous project and how we have struggled to survive the project.

What we ourselves have physically done

Our building has been our major physical project ever since we entered the year 2013. We started the project with insufficient financial requirements. We had no option than to pull our energies together to clear the bushy plot manually. We actually did it without the aid of modern machines. We relied on working tools like cutlasses, hoes, spade and wheelbarrow etc. We dug the foundation with our hands using diggers. We did this with a little help from non-members whom we paid to do some of the technical aspect of the foundational work. Using the wheel barrow, we carried building materials such as sand, blocks and gravel from one place to the other within the building site for easy access.

Dear brother Holloway,  
Greetings to you. How is Donna doing now? We are still praying for her. Last weekend, we took the battle to a village called Angwari, in Jos East, a Local Government annexed to Jos North where we stay. There is no congregation in the entire Local Government. Idol worship has a root in this place. There are a couple denominations in the place as well as Islam. Keep us in prayers as we knock doors, studying the Bible with people. One thing I observed about these people is that there are very receptive. I have responded to Wilson's

mail. Thank you so much. I am glad that dad's sight is returning. May God restore his health to His glory.
