**CAMEROON REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2014--
 ABASIAMA ARCHIBONG**

Dear brethren in Christ, God bless you. I thank you for the opportunity to serve the Lord in the capacity of a missionary. I rejoice on this occasion of another privilege for me to update you with what is happening in the field of Cameroon missions.

To the glory of God, the Church of Christ at Washing Point has been blessed with two precious souls, a lady and a gentlemen. The Lady is Emmanuela and the gentleman is Edwin. Their Baptism pictures are herein attached since one is worth a thousand words. And really we are short of words to describe the wonders of the word's power to change lives. People who had wandered far away have now been brought home and into the fold. It is amazing. More so, it is incredible that we can have such formidable family of West African missions capably coordinated by the minister of the Ellabell Church of Christ. The team is indeed a blessed team.

I thought you would want to know how these two souls finally made the decision to be baptized and saved. Let me begin with the gentleman before the lady. Brother Abanda Edwin is a young man

who is addicted, not of any drug but to our radio preaching program called LET THE BIBLE SPEAK. This preaching program is make the proclamation of the gospel faster than before. We now reach more and more people within the limited time we have on our hands.

For instance, I cannot imagine how else I could have reached someone like Abanda Edwin who lives on the outskirts of Limbe. I don't know how else I could have reached Emmanuela who is an undergraduate student of University of Buea. University students are of rebellious against the gospel. But Emmanuela has chosen to be different. She will be graduating this December 2014. She needs our prayers to remain steadfast in her new found faith.

It is equally important that I share with you some of the progress and challenges that the church at Washing Point is accomplishing in its struggle to help new converts to grow in the knowledge of apostles' doctrine. This has not been easy at all, especially given the circumstances of our state of development in the construction of our building wherein we meet to worship His Majesty. There is the risk of being misunderstood by some of our evangelism prospects. What I mean is this: that there is a tendency for people to think that we are looking those who will come and give us money to complete our building even though we have not said so verbally. The people of Limbe ought to understand that when we were meeting in rented school building in Mile One, we were still preaching and calling on people to come to Christ and be saved. Our goal is to save souls, not to save money. Money does not need salvation, the souls of men do. But what is the reality? Some people think we are looking for numbers to come and contribute their money for a physical building agenda. No, we are not looking for numbers, We are looking people who can become members to join hands with God to reach out to others who are unsaved. However, we believe that Brother Abanda Edwin and sister Emmanuela will stay and grow in their faith like others who understood our message. People like brother Fedinand, and Pa Ndenge, and Bro. and Sis. Mbella(Mr. and Mrs.), just to mention a few of our numerous converts that are still contending industriously for the faith delivered unto them. Thank God for people like them who constitute the proof of our ministry, the evidence that the mission in West Africa is not an exercise in futility. Praise God!

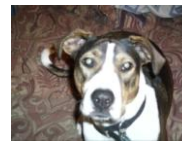

Therefore, I want to thank our entire partner so very much for the cooperation all these years. We are doing well with the mission as a result of an amazing team spirit that characterizes our campaign for Christ in Cameroon and Nigeria. We also remember that His Most Excellency King Jesus promised to be with all stake holders in the soul winning business. He is here with us in this alcohol intoxicated, politically undemocratic, and economically downtrodden Cameroon. He is there with our friends in the Boko Haramic Nigeria. I thank you one and I thank all for blessing our ministry with your support. The difference your partnership has made is profound. God bless you.
