My very beloved in Christ, on behalf of my family and myself, I say greetings to you all in Jesus' Name. We remain grateful to God for saving us and making us partaker of His divine calling and being part of the ministry of reconciliation. I appreciate all of you individually and collectively for your prayers. You may not understand how helpful and encouraging it is to me when I know that a host of Christians are on their knees on my behalf. Truly, God hears and answers our prayers. When my in-laws were in hospital battling for life, you kept praying for them. As I mentioned in my last report, one of them is suffering from partial stroke. This can be very tough especially in a country like Nigeria where it is difficult to access good medical care, beside the fact that there is no provision for handicap people.

Glad to mention that my son Goodnews, instead of pursuing his engineering program at the University, has decided to come first to the Bible College and solidify his faith before facing all the challenges of secular academics. This consolidation of his knowledge in Christ is very important to me because out there in Nigerian Universities, just like many other high institutions in Nigeria is not a good place for young ones to start life. break as the Federal Government extended resumption date for schools to be able to curb the outbreak of Ebola virus in Nigeria. Our joy is that in Heaven, all of these will not be there.



On the 12-15th of August, I was at Akwalbom to attend the annual Lectureship of the Nigerian Christian Bible College. I was assigned to speak on "Christian view of dressing and fashion." It was well attended, such that at the end of the four days, the total attendance was 7000 people (See a cross section of the audience in the picture). That was my first time addressing such a crowd. I was glad because that was where I graduated with a diploma in Bible 27 years ago. I was able to meet some of my mates and some other preachers in the southern Nigeria to share joy and sadness. The Nigerian Christian Bible College encountered a serious setback as a result of internal wrangling. Glad that some people have taken upon themselves to rebuild the place.

Here in Jos, we have 65 new students coming under the different programs of the school. For the first time we had new students up to this number. It is very encouraging to see these young people giving up everything to come to be trained for the work of the Gospel. I am teaching six courses for this semester. Keep

us in your prayers that we will have a hitch free semester. For the past five weeks, I have been teaching at Foron Mission congregation. We chose this topic so that our members will build up their faith in Christ instead of living in fear. Absolutely, one day this life will be over. When that will happen, we do not know, therefore we should be afraid of death to the end that we fail to do the work of our master. I thank God because gradually, they are picking up. After I finished my series on the book of Job with Mazah congregation on our Friday Bible class, the Church decided we should treat prayers. Keep us in your daily prayers. Permit me to use this time to appreciate you all for standing by us.
