As always, it is my great pleasure to welcome you to yet another report from Cameroon. It is my hope that this report reaches you in good health even as your soul remains in a state of optimum spiritual wellness. I am happy to be afforded this chance to narrate to you the Cameroon story of the work of Jesus in the month of July that has just gone by. Charity, it is believed, begins at home. So, I like to begin with the work inside the church premises.



Our Construction

In July I witnessed something so beautiful about the Church of Christ. I am referring to the sight of a two-dimensional construction that occurred concurrently within the church building. The one aspect was the physical construction and the other was the spiritual. Let me discuss our physical construction work first, and then the spiritual of which Jesus promised to be the architect. We are steadily

improving the condition of the church Washing Point meeting place. Brother Richard Niba is at the helm of affairs of the construction of the hall. He is a builder by profession. Below are some pictures of him and his co-workers manually mixing sand with cement to extend the flooring of the building. This aspect is very important in our effort to make the auditorium more conducive to the ever-increasing number of worshipers. In a nutshell, I am saying that the construction of our church hall is in constant progress. The congregation is working consistently hard to get closer and closer to the finish line of this beautiful project. We need your prayers that God will give success in this effort. Let me move over to the other dimension of our construction which focuses on the spiritual. It comes under the next heading.

Our Converts

Of course it is clear that our physical building is subservient to the spiritual



house of God composed of all the members of the congregation. We are determined to complete the hall because the signs of the times of this dispensation of our congregation undoubtedly points to the coming of a super-abundance of converts on their way to the church. This aspect of the building is the Matthew-16.18-kind of construction. It is our co-operative partnership with Christ in reaching out to the unsaved. The beautiful concurrence in July was that the work on the physical building was in progress at the same time as the concluding follow-up evangelism of brother Solivan was being done at one corner of the church hall. He is the young man in green African wear standing up to greet the Church on his first Sunday service with us. Brother Solivan had been listening to our radio preaching for the past two years. He finally came to search for the location of our meeting place while we were seeking to help him with the message of salvation. We spoke to him on that day and he decided that he needed to be baptized. We did exactly as he requested. Today, the 19 year old advanced level student at the brink of university admission is no longer a member of the Presbyterian Church. He is now a member of the washing Point Church of Christ. His former pastor has started persecuting him. He was their youth class teacher. Please pray for Solivan to stand firm on the pillar and ground of the truth. However, your prayer should not only be for Solivan, but also for another July convert new convert, sister Cecilia. She is a middle-aged widow and graduate of Sociology and Anthropology from the

University of Buea. We invited to Church. We studied with her for three months. On one cool Wednesday Bible Class she got immersed. You can see sister Tataw and sister Pauline extending a hug of fellowship to the newly born Christian woman who is a mother of three children with whom she comes to service. Her former pastor of the self-nominated Full Gospel Church is also persecuting her by scandalizing her name in the community with the false allegations that she has gone crazy to join a strange church. Please remember Cecilia when you pray for new converts. These persecutions are very serious. Please, also remember her fatherless children as you pray. They are precious children who have come to be added to the number of our kids at Washing Point. That leads us to the next item.



Our Children

The Washing Point assembly believes in the future role of our children to continue the great work of the great commission. This is what gives us the impetus to ignore the present limitations whatsoever in order to give them the best biblical foundation we can. They are growing strong in their recitations of memory verses and explanation of those passages so memorized. For instance, there is the picture showing Nsikanima, my 7-year old daughter explaining Acts 9.1-3 to the children and the church during a service. The church has a great vision of equipping these wonderfully intelligent children to reach out to their classmates with the story of Jesus adapted to the juniors. These kids also need prayers so that Proverbs 22.6 will positively be fulfilled in them.

Your Charity

In closing, let me wholeheartedly appreciate your good work in helping us to fight the good fight of the gospel. Your support is highly appreciated by all of us. Reason? It has made a life-saving difference in the lives of many. A great change has been made in the lives of the orphans, in the lives of members of my family, in the life of the congregation, and in the lives of people in our community to whom we reach out evangelizing. What a difference! So, even though we are yet to meet face to face but we are feeling your charitable impact month after month and year after year. We simply cannot completely express our depth of gratitude to you all who stand as friends of this unique cause. We thank you very much. May God continue to bless you and your labors in Jesus name.
