DECEMBER 2014 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA



Hello everyone and it is my turn to wish all of you a great and happy new year. It will always be a happy moment whenever the opportunity presents itself for us to send you the news of how God is making all things to cooperate in the superseding interest of soul-winning in Cameroon. We are already entering the ninth year in my service of preaching the

gospel in Cameroon. It feels good to notice how far we have come together, and the accomplishments attained during the past eight years of work in the vineyard of the Lord in Cameroon. My sense of satisfaction has never been more encouraging than it is now. Who will not be grateful to God if they were in my place in Cameroon, working to witness monumental achievements and great transformation of a congregation from one level of growth to another as the years go by? Simply put, The Lord worked with us, and confirmed His word by the conversions that accosted our evangelism expeditions all these fleeting years.

I have not lost sight of my mission in Cameroon. The controlling force of all that I seek to realize in the course of my labors in this country is to lead the lost to the Lord. My mission is evangelism and evangelism is my

mission. I stand today to humbly say that we in Cameroon are reasonably fulfilled to observe the wondrous progress we have so far arrived at. We are also aware that we still have a very long way to go, as long as we believe that the whole country needs to be captured by His grace. In December I left no stone unturned in the process of uncompromisingly campaigning for Christ in Limbe and across the nation. We discovered the effectiveness of mass media preaching more than five years ago. Since then, we have made optimum use of this method that has yielded unimaginably positive results. Souls have been reached with the saving gospel. Baptisms have been fairly constant month after month. I have included the picture of our latest new convert who is now worshipping consistently with the Washing Point congregation ever since he was baptized about two months ago. His baptism pictures I sent last month were unclear, so I have posted to you his fellowship photo for you to rejoice with us as we continue to welcome new members into the family of God in Limbe.

The festive month of December was loaded with church activities geared toward saving the perishing and strengthening the worshipping. Radio preaching that has motivated many to come to Jesus was ground-breaking in December 2014. Although none was baptized in December, but the prospect of a bumper harvest of souls logically connected to what we did in December is being anticipated in the months ahead. That is the evangelistic atmosphere of the 14-year old congregation in Limbe.



Let me now joyfully share with you the landslide achievement that this same congregation has celebrated concerning our church building. I have included a number of pictures to request that you celebrate with us the beginning of the construction of our pulpit area in the auditorium. The flooring has begun and it seems to us like a dream. We began our meeting as a church in public and private school buildings, something similar to the wilderness wanderings except that we had and still have a sense of direction and destination. We later took the bull by the horn after about seven to eight years of tenancy slavery at the hands of the exploitative owners of the poorly constructed facilities we rented.

Today, we no longer have to deal with any landlord; rather we are the landlord of our own meeting place. Although the progress of this project may appear sluggish, we nevertheless know that we will get there someday where we can say about the building work- it is finished. We are a small church with a big vision. We will continue to work with the faith that with God all things are possible to those who believe. This is our hope. This is the faith with which I shall continue to work with you in near perfect partnership in the great commission in West Africa. This commission is the definition of the stay on earth. I will always love to work with all of you as we envision a world dominated by the gospel of Christ. I appreciate all of you for so many reasons, the greatest of which is the prayers you make on our account. Moreover, we always bear in mind that you have made our labors less burdensome by your financial support that has given us the full time to devote to the work that Jesus and the apostles left for us. We thank you for your consistent monetary donations without which we would have had a divided devotion to the mission as working unaided compel gospel laborers to invest more time in extra-evangelistic work for economic sustenance. You have prevented such a distraction all these years. You have demonstrated in an uncommon way that you love the souls of men and are determined in the face of current economic woes in the world to do what you can to help those who have dedicated their lives to the work of the Lord. From all us, me, my family, the orphans and the church in Limbe, we say **THANK YOU AND BE HAPPY THIS NEW YEAR AS ALWAYS.**
