REPORT OF CAMEROON MISSIONS IN JUNE 2015 BY ABASIAMA ARCHIBONG

Our Commission

Fellow workers and colleagues in the gospel vineyard of the Lord, I once again come your way with the current affairs of our gospel undertaking in Cameroon. Simultaneously, I hereby reaffirm my pledge to champion the super-historic cause of Christ in Cameroon. I am so glad to be granted this opportunity say to you what the Lord is both doing and undoing in Cameroon through the Church of Christ for the sake of soul winning. Ever since it was founded, West African Missions has been an irrevocable process of leaving its footprints in the path of the great commission in our great country of Cameroon. Our progress toward that majestic goal is apparent year after year. We understand our need to save souls. We appreciate the immensity of our responsibility to confront every atrocity that Satan has been perpetrating in our land. Foremost of which is Satan's insatiable bid to keep the population blind to their need for salvation. I thank God that into our hands the gospel is given. We are set to revolutionize the work of seeking to save the lost in Cameroon. We are ready to claim Cameroon for Christ.

Our Campaign

With these lofty targets in mind, we were able to descend the valleys and climb the hills in Limbe to reach out to the perishing in their desperate need to hear the same gospel Peter preached on the day of Pentecost to pull about three thousand souls out from unbelief into Christ. Our dedication to this same job in June 2015 has also brought encouraging results. We are indeed encouraged each time we witness the turning point in the life of an individual who would otherwise have lived and died without Christ. The preaching of the gospel is what has made the difference in their lives. Let me now announce the name of the convert who gave went beyond mere listening to actual obedience to the expectation of Christ
