friends and well wishers of the couple to the union between the savior and the saved.

Back in the church at Washing Point, worship is our priority. The church is growing in number and in spirit. My main aim is to teach the brethren the word of God to enable them develop a spirit of Speaking where the Bible speaks and being where it is silent. This is what I have been striving to accomplish more and more over the years. Thankfully I am noticing a tremendous growth in the knowledge level of the word of God in the pew. This we will continue to do, having in mind that we are engaged in constant spiritual warfare with the principalities and powers of evil who seek to overthrow the church and to frustrate evangelism. We need to equip ourselves with God's amour. We need to fight this battle with the spiritual weapons of truth and prayer. We should fight this fight of faith with an awareness that some of our brethren are engaged in a double battle. This reminds me of one of our church members , Lieutenant Yari Emmanuel. He is an officer in the Cameroon Army. I baptized him not many years ago. Since last year he had been posted to the extreme north of Cameroon to fight Boko Haram. He returned alive in the month of May. Please keep Brother Emmanuel in your prayers. Combining military service with Christianity may be very arduous, but with God all things are possible. We all need the supportive prayers of one another. We need encouragement and the strength provided by our reciprocal prayers. With this need in mind, I must at this point pause to say thank you to every one of you who supports our work. Thank you for mentioning us and the work in your prayers. Thank you for touching many lives in Cameroon. Thank you for being our partners in the work of winning souls for Christ. Thank you for remembering the orphans in their trouble. Thank you for keeping a missionary and his family constantly assisted while on the mission field. Thank you for lightening the burden of our congregation. Thank you and God bless you all.
