

## REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2015 (TOM EKPOJ JR)

My very beloved brethren, greetings to you all in the precious name of Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I believe God's mercy and grace are available and sufficient to you, even as God continues to look upon us in Africa. Your prayers are encouraging us, and God is working with every sincere word of prayer you mention to Him about us. On that note, I plead and covet your daily prayers.

It is even more necessary now than ever, that you daily pray for us. Nigeria is on a brink of collapse except God comes to our rescue. Nigeria was supposed to have its national election on the 14<sup>th</sup> February, but that was shifted because of insecurity. Already many Southerners had moved down, and the Northerners who were in South came up. This happened because the political atmosphere was so tensed, and several people were killed by political tugs. Now presidential election is slated for 28 of March and governorship for 8<sup>th</sup> of April. Threat is up again. Last Thursday, the 26<sup>th</sup> of February, twine bomb blast occurred in Jos, near the University of Jos gate. Some students were killed. Those young people who were killed were just coming out of exam halls. Some of them were expected to complete their university education and become useful to themselves and their parents. Yet their lives were cut short by the activities of the evil people. This could have

been anyone, including me. I do not believe I am important than those innocent children slain in their prime. Unfortunately, because of what happened two days before, more rumors were spread of impending attack on Friday. That was why we were unable to go out for our weekend evangelism. We still remain grateful to God because since the beginning of the year, that was the first bomb blast in Jos. We know things will never return to the old good days, but we pray God to grant Nigeria a relative peace to enable us meet for worship regularly, knock doors to study with those who desire to be saved, and sleep peacefully in our homes. Brethren, I truly do not know if we will survive this evil period coming, it is our wish that we will live and testify of God's goodness, even here in the land of the living. But if it is God's will that we lay down the sword, brethren let us continue the good work of faith. The Church of Christ must continue to win souls for heaven.

The month of February came in swiftly and went so fast without notice. Until today the 1<sup>st</sup> of March, I still thought the next day was 29. I forgot that we are in the month of February. I concluded my Sunday lesson on Church Growth at Foron Mission congregation. I am because the congregation at the end of the class agreed that they will join me and my students in weekly evangelism outing. At Mazah congregation, they are already ahead as they are now going out on their own for weekly evangelism. Why this is necessary now than ever is because of the security situation in the nation. I do not desire the evangelism to end if I am no longer here. The Church must continue. The only way this can be guaranteed is if the Church learns to bring in more members. Our congregations must out live us, so that several generations after us will benefit from the pure biblical Christianity. We plan as human, but God has the final answer. However, we pray that congregation in the Northern Nigeria will grow and be able to stand on their own.

My dear brethren, permit me to use this opportunity to express our deep heart of gratitude to all of you have continue to support us in one way or the other. Thank you all for standing by us when our son, Goodnews had an accident. One thing this has reminded me is the fact that in this life nothing is permanent. This is a young boy who developed what was called permanent teeth, but now he now has to go about with artificial teeth. The only thing that is permanent is God. If anyone fails to have God, he has truly failed in everything. I pray we will be among the elect when Jesus will come to take His own home. May God see us through all life struggle to His glory.

A little boy invited his mother to attend his elementary school's first teacher-parent conference. To the little boy's dismay, she said she would go. This would be the first time that his classmates and teacher met his mother and he was embarrassed by her appearance. Although she was a beautiful woman, there was a severe scar that covered nearly the entire right side of her face. The boy never wanted to talk about why or how she got the scar.

At the conference, the people were impressed by the kindness and natural beauty of his mother, despite the scar, but the little boy was still embarrassed and hid himself from everyone. He did, however, get within earshot of a conversation between his mother and his teacher, and heard them speaking. "How did you get the scar on your face?" the teacher asked. The mother replied, "When my son was a baby, he was in a room that caught on fire. Everyone was too afraid to go in because the fire was out of control, so I went in. As I was running toward his crib, I saw a beam coming down and I placed myself over him, trying to shield him. I was knocked unconscious but, fortunately, a fireman came in and saved both of us." She touched the burned side of her face. "This scar will be permanent, but to this day, I have never regretted doing what I did."
