**REPORT FOR THE MONTH
OF APRIL, 2015 (TOM
EK POT JR)**

My very dear brethren,
I greet you all in Jesus name,
thanking God who translated
us from the kingdom of
Darkness to the Kingdom of His

dear Son. Thank you all for taking time to pray for us and our ministry. I tell you even though all trouble would not be taken away here on earth, yet God gives us grace in every situation, to the end that the challenges we face daily do become our daily stepping stone to achievements. Nigeria just escaped what would have been a national disaster. The present "Christian" President conceded defeat to a Muslim president elect. If the Christian man had won the election, the Muslims were ready to throw the country into another blood shade. Well, God chose to do it in a way the poor and the innocent people would not be chased into the street. We thank God because we are allowed to worship our Maker.

However, in the last month, we lost one of brethren in Jos to the Islamic militants. The young man was kidnapped by the terrorists on his way to work. We have prayed and prayed for him, but to no avail. We have no idea if he is still alive. Please, do join us in praying for the will of God to be done.

Our work at Mazah is gradually gaining ground. Interestingly, our Friday Bible class is having more people, as we learn on leadership patterns of Moses, Joshua, and our Lord, Jesus Christ. At Foron Mission, we are making impressive move. This area is a place that has been attacked severally by the terrorist. The Church has suffered so much because of these evil people, but the grace of God has continued to keep us going. While we were in worship last Sunday, the village was attacked by the Islamic militants, and 40 people were killed. Several others sustained various degrees of injuries. Keep the Church in prayers. In the last three weeks, we have been studying on the nature and qualities of true wisdom in the book of James. The brethren are so interested in this lesson. But some days, we feel as if our lives are at risk by passing through the dangerous road leading to the village. But I tell you, God has continued to be with us. We are trying to bring up people who would continue to lead even if we are forcefully ejected from Plateau State. Our ministries should continue even if we are dead.

God had helped us at Toro, since the graduation of brother Sani from the School of Biblical Studies last year, he returned to work with the congregation there. His presence has saved me from so many troubles, especially weekly plying that road that is so deadly. However, the Church request that I should be there from time to time, which is fine by me.

At the School of Biblical Studies, we are vacating on the 16th May after our 23rd annual graduation ceremony. Our 12th annual Gospel lectureship comes up on the 13th-15th May. I have invited several Elders, preachers, and Bible Teachers across the country to speak in this year's lectureship. Please, do join us praying for it to be successful. Last year, we experienced the most deadly bomb attack in Jos during our graduation. We pray everything will go well to the glory of God this time around. During this month, I baptized three

young girls who decided to give their lives to Christ. Keep praying for their spiritual growth please.



During this last month, I was invited to speak in a lectureship organized by a congregation in the riverine community of Andoni in Rivers State. I travelled over 940 KM to be at that occasion. Even though the program witnessed poor turnout, yet the few participants were so glad to be part of the lectureship. At Andoni, people make plans on what they get each day from the bank of the rivers. It was interesting to see people gathering lobsters and other things to make a living. Andoni is made up of some five islands. Road network is very poor. I had to keep my car far and went on motor cycle and sometimes foot. They are about three small congregations in this locality. This was my third time of being there, things don't change much, but the people's faith is intact in Christ. Brethren, we are grateful for your kindness towards us. Keep praying for us. Several people have died for Christ, if we eventually die for Christ, that will be to His glory.
