OCTOBER 2015 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA ARCHIBONG

Greetings to you all, and welcome to October report of what the Lord is doing in Cameroon. We appreciate your continued interest in the growth of the kingdom of Christ in Cameroon. The month of October is usually a time of reflection in both Nigeria and Cameroon, as the citizens of both countries take a day off to reflect on different themes of national importance. Nigerians celebrate their independence on 1st October while Cameroonians join the rest of the world to celebrate the international day for teachers. As a Nigerian resident in Cameroon for mission work, the month was a memorable adventure.

The month began promisingly with an indication that if we worked harder, there was likely going to be unprecedented results. October 2015 marked the first time in my entire ministry when I baptize a Jehovah's Witness. Brother Edmond from Bali Community



of Northwest Cameroon had been following our preaching on radio

for a considerable length of time. He could no longer bear to let himself be deluded by the doctrine of the self-deluded doctrines of denominationalism. He simply came to the church on a Sunday but not in the month the under review. After stating how he came in contact with the Church at Washing Point, Edmond simply said he was interested in further study with us. The series of evangelistic



studies with him ended in October when he decided to be baptized. It is a great story among us here because it is unprecedented, at least in the region of Cameroon where I live and work. The picture of the joyous smile of Sister Judith Tiambushi as she welcomes Edmond to the fellowship speaks volumes about the

significance of this earth quaking conversion reminiscent of the conversion of Saul of Tarsus. His baptism was done after a Wednesday Bible Class almost in the night which explains why the pictures may not be very bright.

Another fruit of our October campaign for Christ is that of Sister Henriette Eko. She was immersed very early in the month. Her pictures are also attached to this report. The Lord is confirming the power of His unchanging word by the conversions that follow our preaching day in day out.

Also in the month, I undertook a very perilous journey to a village called Muyenge for the monthly Fako/Littoral gospel Lectureship to speak on a theme in the subject of Worship. The journey was necessary because of the salvation of the souls of the Muyenge people but it was a difficult because the road to that village is infested with thieves and robbers like the one linking Jerusalem to Jericho. In addition to the danger of thieves, the Muyuka Muyenge road is one of the worst in Cameroon. Its roughness is better described than experienced. A car cannot go there. Only motor cycles and trucks can maneuver their way through the rugged and extremely broken road. It takes about two hours for the bike to vibrate its way through, leaving your waist and

backbone almost dislocated. That was the journey out of Limbe. Indeed, "where sin has gone, must go His grace, the Gospel is for all".



Another important news of the month is that concerning our groundbreaking "LET THE BIBLE SPEAK" which has promoted the spread of the gospel and at the same time paralyzing the denominational doctrines in our communities. The threat of the legal action mounted by a group of denominational "pastors" against me and the program has turned out for the good of the gospel. We have won the battle. The said pastor who tried to sue me to court has lost the case and Eden Radio has banned him from preaching through that station. I have been awarded the time that was formerly used by these enemies of the gospel. I now preach on Sunday morning and Sunday evening in addition to Friday evening on that radio. I was ready to go to prison if the self-nominated Apostle Dr. Princewill Kenneth won the case rather than compromise the gospel. We thank God for the victory. We thank all our partners for all the prayers.

The Church at Washing Point is united and co-operative. We growing and struggling to do more for the Lord. Our building project is still a challenge but we are resolved to carry it on to completion.

All is well that ends well. The month of October ended nicely. Thanks to God and thanks to our supporters who have been so nice to us in ways we simply cannot completely express our appreciation. We thank you. God bless you all.
