DECEMBER 2015 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA

Our Campaign

“Can you tell me where it is stated in the Bible that John the Baptist was baptized?”, said a listener of LET THE BIBLE SPEAK, angrily. As if that was not enough, the same caller who identified himself as James from Bubende in Limbe, further challenged, “Can you show me where it is written in the Bible that you should tell people to call you on radio for baptism?”. These are just a few of the rebellious questions posed by people who defensively listen to our preaching. Such a heart is barricaded with bias, and epitomizes the wayside soil which Jesus mentioned in the parable of the sower. It baffles me to hear such questions from people who seem to be religious. However, we thank God that the story does not end there. The story of our evangelism in the month of December transcends the boundaries of people who have made up their minds to resist the gospel call just to protect their denominational territory. Our evangelism story extends further to include marvelous people who obviously had been searching for the truth. These ones are the kind that are noble-minded. One outstanding example of such fair-minded people is brother Elma from Down Beach here in Limbe. He was baptized in December as a result of having carefully followed the presentations of LET THE BIBLE SPEAK

broadcast on Eden Radio for about a year. The ending of 2015 marked a turning point in his life. Brother Elma is in his early 50's, and we are happy to have him numbered among us in Christian membership and fellowship with the Washing Point congregation.

Our Congregation

It is indeed true that the church is built upon the rock. The storms of persecution that trailed our efforts to win souls in December cannot be forgotten so soon. This persecution was practically carried by denominational "pastors" who seem to be very offended to hear our preaching on radio and television that there is one gospel of one faith that motivates people to submit to the one baptism. They hate to hear that the purpose of miracles has been accomplished ever since the word of God was confirmed. They wishfully think that miracles are still happening. Such thinking makes them to dislike our evangelism. Nevertheless, the congregation at Washing Point is strong and battle-ready in the work of soul-winning. The church with whom I serve Christ is growing strong and healthy in terms of unity and co-operation in work and worship. This unity goes beyond the borders of Limbe to include the oneness that we enjoy in working with other congregations without destroying the local congregational autonomy. For example, we are working with, but not limited to, other congregations such as the Muea and Buea churches of Christ in the southwest region of Cameroon to ensure that in no distant time a television program of evangelism is kick-started to reach out to a wider audience. With this vision of a television outreach, we believe that more work will certainly be accomplished in West Africa.

Our Construction

I reported to you in November that the second half of 2015 witnessed a slowdown in the church building project because of the poor turnover in our internal efforts to donate for the building. This New Year 2016 promises to be better than last year. We have already begun work in the area of doors and windows. Hopefully by the time of February report, there will be pictures of our auditorium showing the main door and the others put in place. It is a gradual process, and we are patiently working and waiting to worship in a

completed building. As it is now, we still have reasons to thank God that we are not worshipping in a rented residential or school building. Though the structure is yet incomplete, but its existence has made facility rentage obsolete. Thanks to God and to our friends and supporters.
