 CAMEROON BY
 ABASIAMA

“Happy New Year” is the normal greeting that is exchanged by nearly everybody as people enter a new year. To my mind,

there is very little or nothing wrong with this custom that appears to enjoy a universal appeal. However, I have come to realize that the main purpose of life on earth is not happiness but holiness. Yes, the New Year 2016 is already presenting a mixture of events. Some of these events are joyful and exciting, while others are sorrowful and tough to experience. Nevertheless, I still have reasons to wish all of you a very happy new year once again.

Our New Year celebration in Cameroon has been a series of pleasant moments of happy fellowship in the family of God here in Limbe and elsewhere in the country. The year 2016 has come with numerous prospects of a better service to be rendered by the church to advance the cause of Christ on earth. Please join us to share the joy of one soul who has repented and has been baptized. Sister Utia Sama

was added to the Washing Point Church of Christ in the first month of this year. This conversion has come as a fruit of the evangelistic inspiration in the congregation with whom I serve the Lord. Our prayer is that this spirit of seeking the lost to get them saved by the Lord should continue to characterize the congregation in all circumstances.



Let me now introduce another subject in this report. It is a sad one. It is incredibly sorrowful, particularly to me. My dear brethren, your brothers and sisters in Cameroon are crying. We are in tears. I am in tears even as I write this report. A young Christian man has been brutally killed by Boko Haram. Yes, we know that we are not to sorrow like people who have no hope. However, this horrifying murder perpetrated by Boko Haram has pierced our hearts in the church in Cameroon. Brethren, you may recall the baptism of my next door neighbor, a military officer called Lt. Yari Emmanuel. He was recently promoted to the rank of a captain. You can trace that report of his conversion from the archives of the Ellabell Church bulletin index of Cameroon reports.

When brother Emmanuel came home this January, I was very happy to see him again after a long while. I was happy to give him a Roger Dickson study Bible. As his time to return to the war front in the far north region, I remember asking him, "Captain, when will you be back?" To the question, brother Emma replied, "Preacher, you can

only know when you are going but not when you will be back. Just pray for me". Little did I know that my neighbor will not even come at all, except as a lifeless body to be buried by the Cameroonian government. He was in his early thirties. His father, a retired army man, and mother are alive. He was killed along with twenty other soldiers under his command. He was not just a neighbor but a friend to my children. He was a civilized military man who could be approached with the good news of Christ. His is what is making news in our national and local media broadcast. When we heard his name on radio today it brought us to tears again. Is this our own happy new year? As I grapple with this question, the words of Hymn 119 in our Songs of the Church irresistibly come to mind:

"When death has come and taken our loved one, it leaves our home so lonely and drear. Then do we wonder why others prosper, living so wicked year after year. Farther along we'll know all about it.....Cheer up my brother, live in the sunshine. We'll understand it all by and by".
