## NOVEMBER 2015 REPORT FROM CAMEROON BY ABASIAMA

“You Never Mentioned Him to Me”, is perhaps one of the most heart-rending titles of a song crafted to inspire the fire of evangelism in us. I am compelled by a mixture of reasons to begin this report with great gratitude. One such reason is the love of God that glows like a flame within the hearts of all the stakeholders of West African Missions. Another reason is the personal commitment and generosity of our partners. Also, is the progressive results of our monthly labors in the vineyard of evangelizing the unsaved and edification of the saints.

My heartfelt thanks goes first to the Lord Himself. He has been faithful in honoring His word in our preaching campaign in Cameroon. Also, I cheerfully wish to tell you all our supporters that God has been glorified by your gifts of generosity constantly demonstrated towards the work of soul-winning in our country of Cameroon. Your benevolent commitment to our mission of evangelism is producing a harvest of souls for the Lord month to month. I thank God always in my prayers for all of you dear partners. Thank you for contributing to the finding of purpose in the lives of so many. The difference our partnership in the gospel has made is visible for all to see in the life of the congregation and its converts. As always, I recognize our preaching work in West Africa as a serious undertaking. I don't play with it. That is why I must commit my best efforts to this work so as to make sure that I do not miss any providential

opportunity to share Christ's love with those who love to know the way of true life found only in Jesus.

In the penultimate month of 2015, we assembled our best tools of evangelism and rolled up our sleeves to sweat for Jesus. I preached as usual at the pulpit in Church. I preached also on radio 4 hours a week. I preached on television 2 hours each Saturday for three consecutive weeks in November. I made personal contact with those whom our preaching through the media draw their attention. As a result, souls have been converted to the Lord.



Among the newly saved is brother Devine. He was baptized purely as a direct result of following our LET THE BIBLE SPEAK on EDEN RADIO. He is a good young man. I hope to mentor him to maturity like I did with brother Ferdinand. In addition, I also baptized Javes who had been addicted to our radio preaching for years. That is what the Lord is doing here through your vision and generosity.



As for the congregation at Washing Point, I am glad to speak about the grace of God upon this church. We are a united household of God in Limbe, shining through the gloom of a perverse generation of Cameroonians. Our building project is a bit stagnant but we are planning to put some doors and windows in the coming year.

We are grateful to God for His blessings upon this work. We will also continue to pray for one another that every hindrance to the spread of the

gospel in Cameroon and elsewhere will be surmounted. One such hindrance presented itself in the month of November 2015. It had to do with my residence permit. My last permit was issued on 22/11/2013. The police and the immigration promised that it was going to be a permit that would be valid for 10 years. It turned out to be a lie. When the original copy of the permit came from Yaounde, behold it was just for 2 years again. I pay the Cameroon government close to \$400 every two years to stay and preach in Cameroon. I am supposed to spend that amount in acquiring a 10-year residence permit but the wickedness and corruption of the police and immigration would not allow me, even after presenting all documents to certify my authenticity as a missionary. They love money, and have to exploit even a preacher to maintain their corrupt status. In November it was terrible for me to meet up with the documents requirements. I had to go to Douala to have a certain professional I.D. card from the board of trustees. I moved here and there, running up and down because of this perennial problem. However, right now I am almost through with the paper work and the residence permit bottleneck will soon disappear but not for 10 years. One corrupt police officer even suggested that I should go to the ministry of Agriculture to acquire a license as a farmer instead of insisting to be documented as a missionary. He was serious about it. He knew that I am eligible to have a 10-year permit as a missionary but they don't want to give it to me because they consider it a disadvantage to their covetous agenda. It seems they will still give me another 2 years instead of 10 years. There is nothing more I can do to prevail on the people to give me justice. I need your prayers to overcome the exaggerated immigration policies of Cameroon.

Finally, my brethren, I have resolved to continue the good fight that apostle Paul left for all of us. I am happy to work with all of you. I am grateful to be supported by you. The orphan children under our care are better off as a result of the difference you are making in their lives. The Church of Christ in Limbe and many other congregations in Cameroon are better off because you care. My finally is growing along with the church. May God be glorified as we keep on working together to save souls and to keep the saved souls saved. God Bless you.
