ABASIAMA'S REPORT OF JUNE 2016 FROM CAMEROON

Dear brethren and co-workers in Christ, it is another great privilege for me to come your way again through this report with Christ's love and warmest regards from Cameroon. Though you are so far away from the shores of Africa, yet you are so near in heart to us. Our wonderful partnership is a great source of strength and comfort to us in this work of the kingdom of God.

Of primary importance in my mind is the proclamation of the gospel which we did in the month of June just gone by. Yes, it was a bit rainy, but we considered them to be showers of blessing. In the rain we still preached and people listened but there was no conversion. We will continue to do the evangelistic proclamation with the hope that God will continue to bless our struggles with souls to save. Our delight will continue to be in soul-winning, and with God's help, we will live to see our large auditorium filled to capacity with the redeemed someday. Please do join us in praying about the germination of the seed of God's word that we sowed in various hearts in Limbe during the month in retrospect. Only God knows those who are seriously considering becoming members of our congregation in the near future. I am sure that soon; the heavens will rejoice again over 'one sinner who repents'. For now, we are still

rejoicing over the many recent new converts with whom the congregation is blessed. Some of them have already begun doing great things in the Lord's vineyard. Worthy of mention is brother Edmond who wakes up not later than 5:00 a.m. every Sunday morning to transport me on his motorcycle to Eden Radio station for Sunday morning evangelism.

As we continue to celebrate our work of preaching in the month



of June this year, we will not overlook the improvements that the Washing Point congregation is making on the building project. The work on the windows is making the auditorium a little more protected and beautiful. Thanks to the dedication of the entire group, and special thanks to brother Ferdinand, one of our most faithful brothers who came to the church about 5 years ago through our radio evangelism. He is a welder and the workmanship of the iron protectors is credited to him. It is an amazing work. Gradually, we are taking the building to another level. It is the Lord's doing, and is marvelous in our eyes. We will no longer move from one school building to another because it is a dawn of our own new era that makes us forget the pains of our early days of nomadic congregational life.

In the midst of these joyous achievements recorded in the month of June, we have had our own share of sorrow once again barely 4 months after Boko Haram killed brother Emmanuel. Another death has occurred of one of us in Christ. It happened on Thursday the 30th, the last day of the month. Her name is Freeda Ewome. Freeda had been an active member of the then Mile One Church of Christ about 4 years prior to my assumption of ministerial duties with the congregation in 2007. She remained committed to worship and work of the church ever-after until the end of June when she left us to be with the Lord. I am happy to tell you that sister Ewome a caring personality who courageously left the Presbyterian Church about 13 years ago when she came to know the truth that set her free. She was afflicted with diabetes for about 15 years. She was 48. She will be buried in Buea on Saturday 16th July 2016. Her life was one of the best sermons the church heard a sister preach without words. Please pray for the Ewome's family and the church for consolation as the grief process has already started.



And finally dear brethren, we will continue to appreciate your partnership with us in this work. We thank you for your love and devotion to the work of service in Africa. We are grateful for your prayers. We are thankful for associating with us in Cameroon to win souls for Christ. We pray that the Lord will keep you, and make His face shine upon you in Ellabell, Raytown, Statesboro, just to name a few of our supporters. We love you all. Good bye and God bless.
