REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 2016 (TOM EK POT JR)

Greetings to you all from Nigeria in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I pray that this find you all

strong in the Lord despite the varying circumstances that life presents. My family is doing just fine. Even though I came down with malaria, I still consider myself lucky because when I treated it, I regained myself. Beside, those things are there to remind us that this world is not ours.

I am glad for the grace of God that was available to us throughout the month of May. The month of May is always one hectic period for me because of the series of activities available for us. As I mentioned in my last month report, I took a group of 8 students to one part of Abuja for door-knocking for Christ. Precisely I went to a place called Dutse Alhaji. Dustse

Alhaji is one of the districts in Abuja. Even though it was not a place inhabited by the rich people and big people in Government, yet the life style of Abuja influenced the inhabitants of this place. They hardly pay attention to Bible study. This was my first time of going to that place. It is a vast area with several people, especially the Muslims. But the Church is located in the midst of some Mosques. It was a tough time for us moving from house to house and from shop to shop discussing the Bible with people. Some people refused us discussing with them while others welcome us, but won't let us sit in their homes. Most of the studies were conducted with people outside their homes. We spoke to over 250 people in 8 days. About 102 studies were set up. Each evening, we had an in-door lectureship that the members brought in their



friends. Within that period alone, I presented 5 public lectures. On the last Saturday, we had an in-door seminar. It was well attended. But to my surprise, no one was willing to be baptized for Christ. I was glad that

we had sown the seed. The seed will germinate in due course. My students found the place difficult because of the harsh weather condition. The difference in temperature between Jos and Dutse Alhaji was



so wide that they almost felt sick. But we thank God that we all came back safely. The Church was very much pleased that we came to work with them. We are hoping that they will follow up the studies we set up,

to encourage those prospects to come to Jesus. I am putting the picture of Dutse Alhaji congregation during worship service for your view. I am equally placing the picture of the campaigners for your view.

Returning from evangelism campaign on the 15th May, I was up and down trying to put things in place for our 13th annual lectureship that came up on 18th – 20th May. The three



days' program was well attended. We had people coming in from other countries like Niger, Togo, and Sierra Leon. One of my students from Niger invited his Muslim mother to attend his graduation. Sandra discussed with her the gospel. At the end of the day, the woman was baptized into the Church. She has since returned to Niger as a Christian no more a Muslim. I am placing her picture for your view. Our 24th annual graduation exercise came up on the 21st of May. This time around 34 preachers were sent into the field to harvest souls for

Christ. I am also putting their picture for your view. Thank you all for your prayers. We would not have reached this far without God using you to walk hand in hand with us. May God bless you all.



Come this Saturday 4th June, I will be leaving for Delta State for two weeks, training local

preachers around Delta State. Keep praying for us.

We are really grateful for your support. Nigeria is facing one of its toughest time in terms of economic melt-down. Things are so difficult, and life has become unbearable with the common people. Please, do remember this country in your prayers.
