Never miss a chance to shut up.



Dear Ladies,

Greetings from cool France. In June we had a few nice days but July was mostly rain and cooler temperatures. I hope this is finding all of you well. On the 3rd of June I had to go for the mammogram and since they found a cyst I had to do another and a scan. They will keep an eye on it. On the 6th I had to see a cardiologic (heart doctor) as my blood pressure was too high when I saw the gynecologist. There is a murmur but he wrote to my generalist and told him to increase my blood pressure and the circulation medicines too. He doubled my blood pressure medicine and gave me new circulation medicine too. I am doing well and feel better.

On the 7th of June I was sent to a osteoporosis specialist and he told me my bones are 9 % stronger than most women my age and the problem I have in the right leg is tendinitis in the muscle. That was good news!

I also was sent for a Doppler test for veins and had a good report there too. They x-rayed the abdomen region and hips. So the 3rd, 5th, 6th, 9th, 14th, and 16th were taken up with doctor appointments.

On the 18th we went to Lily Rose's school and participated in their doings. I fell there and was bruised but fine and had fallen the week before walking my dog. My little dog just waited for me not moving. The sidewalk didn't give so had a sore arm and muscles for a few days.

On the 12th on a Sunday night we had a church meal with the Eng/French brethren who meets on Sunday nights. It was very nice and we all still miss Paul and Edie Tews. On the 23rd of June we went to Franck at Liva's for the Bible study and Colette came with us. On the 24th we were back at Lily Rose's school to hear them sing. She hid behind a girl pretty much until her teacher led the singing then sang. We could hardly get a photo.

On the 26th was the fellowship meal with the group that meets on Sunday mornings. It was delicious too.

The 29th I had to be at Rose Mary's to watch the girls while Rose Mary and Manu had something to do with his work selling a dinner with cheeses and salad.

On July 2nd, I had to be at Rose Mary's at 1:00 in the afternoon to watch children. On the 3rd several of the women went out to eat in our neighborhood together after worship and had a great time.

On July 4th I had an English study with Cyndie from the Florist and she enjoyed it.

On Monday we had a visit from Atlas and Clarise Ford. Atlas and I were in grade school together and graduated together in 1968 from Farrell High School. They had some spaghetti and we enjoyed a nice time around the kitchen table talking about how many of our classmates are gone and catching up on news on some of the others.

I was babysitting for Gabrielle that day and she kissed them goodbye and they were so pleased. Plus we had Franc and Liva come in to visit with us and Pamela. On the 14th I went to Rose Mary's with Josiane and Alisa and her two boys to celebrate Gabrielle

Roland left for Gemendun, Germany for Bible camp with Colette, Pamela, Emmanuel, and Giovally on the 8th of July and came back on the 16th.

Cyndie came at ten a.m. on the 11th and Natalie at 10:30 for English studies. I use a Bible based encyclopedia for this The Book of Life. Natalie Nguyen and her Mom came on the 12th then Cyndie on the 18th. On the 21st of July I had to be at Rose Mary's and on the 22nd. On the 25th and 26th, Gabrielle and Lily-Rose stayed the nights with Grandma while their Dad, Manu had his tonsils removed. He is home and doing fine.

On the 30th of July the church had a picnic and I decided not to go as I was tired and had to make an appointment with doctor for the 2nd of August so he could check blood pressure. It was ok.

Rose Mary cleaned armoires at her apartment and I cleaned mine plus some closets and I gave away ten sacks of clothes. Then the next week I gave away two other sacks as someone came and gave some clothes just for that purpose. I have another sack to give away too and some of the clothes

were brand new from my neighbor's boss and some were new from the twins neighbor.

The month of July has been cool and rainy nearly every day but for two days. I was really concerned about Roland getting burnt but it is fine and the people at camp really enjoyed his cooking and they had several nights of food from different nations, as Mexican, Lebanese, American, Italian, French and Boy Scout cooking. Pamela McAdams said that she never ate so good at a Bible camp before. Since she works at several camps that is quite a compliment.

So ladies while Roland was gone to camp and I had the house to myself, I got some Spring Cleaning done a little late, and filled up lots of trash bags too. Then I took out Josiane for her birthday to eat in our neighborhood on the 14th of July which is Bastille Day or Independence Day in France. We had spent the afternoon till evening at Rose Mary's for Gabrielle's party and were happy to get a chance to visit as she had had lots of colon problems. Thanks for prayers for all the sick. Celine's treatments are soon to be finished for cancer. This is Giovally's Mother.

This is all that I can think of for now. Thanks to each and every one of you for helping us stay and teach others in France and other French nations. Colette is living with us for about 3 months now and is looking for an apartment and found one that she will move into soon.
