

Lilies of the Field in Israel

In the Sermon on the Mount the Lord

told His disciples to "Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these" (Matt. 6:28-29). The "lilies of the field" are not the flower we call a "lily" in this country, for they are not found in Palestine. The "lilies of the field" are the scarlet poppies which bloom from a bulb after the spring rains.


Lilies bloom for only one day and carpet the plains and hills of Palestine with colorful blossoms. In their brief life they are clothed with a beauty which surpasses the beauty of the robes of kings. Yet, with all the glory of the lily, when they died they were used for nothing better than for burning in order to raise the temperature of a clay oven (Matt. 6:30).

If God gives such beauty to a short-lived flower, how much more will He care for man, the crown of His creation?

In Jesus Name

At the close of our prayers, both public and private, we use the scriptural phrase "in Jesus' name." We use this phrase even though the instructions concerning asking in His name are primarily written to the apostles (Jn. 12:36b; 14:13-14; 16:23-24). There is also no example of a prayer in the New Testament that closes with these words. However, it is right that we use these words. Yet what does it mean to pray in the name of Jesus? "In the thought of the ancient world a name does not merely distinguish a person from other persons, but is closely related to the nature of its bearer" (*Theological Word Book of the Bible*, Alan Richardson, editor). The "name" of God and Jesus reveal their nature and will. The phrase "in Jesus' name" is not some magic formula we are to tack on the end of our prayers guaranteeing that they will be answered no matter what the content. The phrase is to mean we are praying in agreement with the will of Jesus. In fact, there seems to be nothing in scripture against closing our prayers with the words "according to the will of Jesus." The apostle John wrote, "This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears—we know that we have what we asked of him" (1 Jn, 5:14-15). Do our prayers agree with the will of Jesus?
