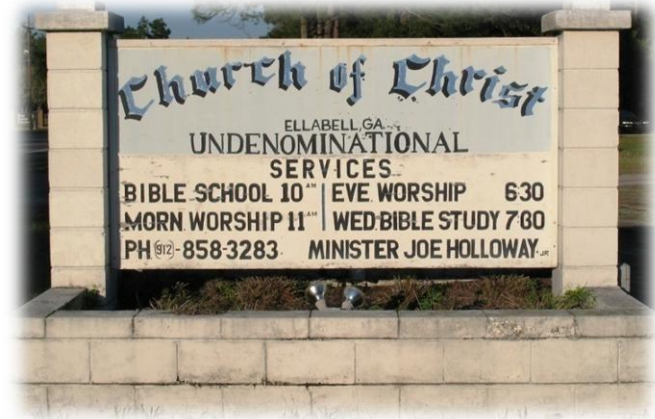

ABASIAMA'S REPORT OF SEPTEMBER 2011 FROM CAMEROON

We rejoice in the Lord for His matchless grace on the basis of which every achievement recorded by the West African Missions could be interpreted. In as much as His word has been our ultimate standard in our every evangelistic effort and broadcast, His rich mercy remains our point of reference each time we want to talk about accomplishments occasioned by our work of missions here in Cameroon. With this in mind, we will always give the Lord thanks for keeping His promise of His presence attached to the Great Commission. He has been with us always as we reached out to those who are yet to receive the light of His word into their lives.

In September we stormed several places with the message of the gospel to people who gave us their time and attention. Several studies of the Bible were conducted during the period under reappraisal. Many of them have indicated interest in further studies, while others said they will be baptized after

careful investigation of the gospel that we have preached to them.

The work of declaration of the good news in the mass media is still doing great things in the city of Limbe and other towns that can receive our broadcast on radio. This radio evangelism is worth talking about every time because a number of souls have been brought to Christ through the faith that came by hearing of God's message. It was the power of this gospel air force that brought Brother Ebai Ayuk to put his faith in Jesus Christ in September. Along with the host of heaven, may we rejoice in the Lord that one precious soul is now a Christian. This same medium of gospel propagation, empowered by the Lord's grace, has brought the church out of obscurity into publicity so that the church has now taken its rightful place as a house on the hill in the city where the thief has come to kill. Let us keep praying for those who have heard the word and are at the verge of crossing the Jordan of sin into the kingdom of Christ. In fact prayer requests like this have changed suspects into prospects and then into converts in this Limbe. May God give us the strength to keep up the campaign for Jesus.

Campaigning for Christ in the just concluded month of September was going on side by side with a far inferior campaign of the politicians who have been seeking to have themselves elected into various offices of political power. The October 9, 2011 presidential elections which is being conducted today, has affected many things in the social life of the nation. These effects became more pronounced in September. The service of our worship was equally affected today because churches have been prohibited from assembling beyond 7 a.m., at least for today. The Mile One church had to begin worship by 5.30 a.m and dismissed before 7.00 a.m. Many church members could not make it to the worship at such an unusual schedule that greatly affected the turnout of worshippers. Our average attendance of 60 nowadays was dropped to less than 15 today because of this election with its attendant rumors of war that has assumed its greatest proportion now. Please pray for the church in Cameroon to come out of the possible calamity of war. The 23 short-listed candidates who are fighting to be

elected to become the chief tenant of the presidential palace in Yaounde have vowed not give peace a chance should there be any election malpractice. These threats have been freely announced on radio and television , thereby casting a shadow of fear and terror over the nation. Please do know that Cameroon is sitting on a timed bomb and it is only the grace of God that can incapacitate this looming danger. Towards the concluding week of September, bombs yet to be detonated were discovered in ELECAM (the Cameroon national body constituted to conduct elections) building which is less than half a kilometer from where we live in Mile One. Had such grenades got to the point of detonation, we only leave what could have happened to us to imagination. However, the general discontent over the 3-decade presidency of Paul Biya is a reality that cannot rule out the probability of violence and destruction in this country.

Come what may, we will never lose sight of the great contribution you have been making to ensure the furtherance of the gospel in Cameroon. My family and I wish to say thank again for having renewed your financial commitment to us. The orphans equally are grateful to you all for the help they continually receive from you. We all are so thankful to God for moving you to make a difference in our lives and service to the Lord. Do remain blessed and please keep us in your prayers.
