

ABASIAMA'S OCTOBER 2011 REPORT FROM CAMEROON

In Christ I am so happy to come your way again with the newsletter that reflects the workings of God through us as laborers in his universal and local vineyard. In Cameroon, things are networking for the good of the kingdom citizens. We thank God that it has been His good pleasure to give us more reasons to move ahead in our determination to preach the gospel in this hazardous time. The abounding iniquity in the world is equally taking its toll in the lives of people in Cameroon. The people of the city of Limbe in particular are increasingly walking away from God. That is why we have intensified our campaign for Christ in Cameroon even during a politically tense month of October during which the presidential elections that created unprecedented apprehension in the nation. Finally the October 9 elections were conducted and the incumbent president Paul Biya perpetuated. Tension is still looming in the country as the other 22 aggrieved political opponents are flexing their political muscle to topple the 3 decade old regime in power since 1982. While the world was tied up in their own affairs, we in the West African Missions outpost were busy fulfilling our commission as fishers of men.

Thank God that two big fish were caught and dragged out of the water of the world of sin into the water of life--Jesus Christ. Brother Godwin Ibe Nwachuke, a family man was baptized into Christ. Here is the picture of the tall man whom I baptized upon the basis of his acceptance of the gospel this month of October. His conversion has been a great news to his family. Before the Church of Christ met Godwin with the gospel, he was a member of a risky denomination known as The Apostolic Faith. Immediately after his immersion as we conversed with him, he was



so excited that he has found the truth that has saved him not only from eternal condemnation but also denominational doctrines that almost led to the death of his children. How? This is Godwin's story: The Apostolic Faith believes that a child of God is healed by faith only and therefore should not receive any medical treatment no matter the severity of the illness. Taking medicine is considered as a demonstration of lack of

faith. Brother Godwin has seven children and has nearly lost two of them through sickness and with any medical aid because of the teachings of his former church. He said the children almost died if not by God's gracious intervention. Nwachuku is so deeply touched that at last he has found the truth he and the family are blessed to know the truth of Christ taught in the church of Christ. He says he has been set free indeed. Let us join the angels of God in celebrating Nwachuku's freedom from falsehood of the presumptuous Apostolic Faith denomination.

Being in this fulltime ministry since 2005 and assuming duties with the Mile One church since 2007, I am excited to lead this wonderful congregation in loving God, caring for people, and reaching the world. I have experienced the power of God's divine orchestration in my labors as a minister. With our congregation's ministry experience and a deep desire to follow God's plan for the

Church of Christ, we are wonderfully blessed with new converts frequently as a sign of divine participation in our great commission. We are now having two ladies in the church with the name Esther. We have Esther Ojong and now we also have Esther John who was baptized on the 29th of October, almost coinciding with the birthday of the Ellabell Church of Christ. As we continue to explore avenues to win souls and serve God in



virtually every capacity within the church, we are rejoicing that the Lord is still adding to the church "daily" such as should be saved. May we continue to enjoy evangelism and see it as a joyful privilege and not as an agonizing obligation.

We believe that until the Church of Christ loves God with all of heart, soul, mind, and strength we will not care for people as Christ does. Caring for people is both caring for the physical and the spiritual needs of a person. Loving God and caring for people finds its fullest expression in reaching the world with His word through evangelism. Our families, our neighbors, the less fortunate, and those

in other nations God has called us to reach. We will always thank you for joining with us to achieve this noble goal. The church at mile One is moving on well in the midst of perilous challenges. We now have less than two months to quit the use of the current premises of the school where we gather to worship. Please pray with us that our new converts will not be stranded as we continue to search for another place to rent since the church is



handicapped, at least for now, as far as having our own meeting place is concerned. The countdown has begun and only God knows what will happen next in this regard. We need prayers for God to



pleasantly surprise us by providing for us a place where we can assemble to worship and work for Him. We believe He will surely hear our earnest cry. And we thank you in advance for your prayers.
